AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1658 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CYNTHIANA AND CREATING NEW POSITIONS AND CLASS TITLES WITHIN THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT TO BE KNOWN AS DIS TRIBUTION FOREMAN, DISTRIBUTION OPERATOR II, DISTRIBUTION OPERATOR I, DISTRIBUTION TRAINEE, METER READER II, METER READER I, AND METER READER TRAIN-EE AND ELIMINATING THE POSITIONS OF SENIOR METER READER AND METER READER.

**ORDINANCE NO. 1681** 

WHEREAS, the city commission of the City of Cynthiana Kentucky adopted Ordinance No. 1658 creating class titles, paygrades and salary scales for established positions for the City of

Cynthiana, and WHEREAS, the City of Cynthiana wishes to amend Ordinance No. 1658 so as to create new positions and class titles within the Public Works Department to be known as Distribution Foreman Distribution Operator II, Distribution Operator I, Distribution Train ee, Meter Reader II, Meter Reader I and Meter Reader Trainee, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COM-MISSION OF CYNTHIANA AS FOLLOWS:


