collection of talent became a team and a family.” Coastal Carolina won the national title in 2016 and was trying to become the first team since 1962 (Michigan) and the fifth all-time to win the championship in its first two CWS appearances. With five-time champion coach Skip Bertman watching from the stands, LSU tied it at 1 in the third on Ethan Frey’s RBI double and went up 5-1 in the fourth on two-run singles by Chris Stanfield and Derek Curiel. Coastal Carolina pulled within 5-3 in the seventh against LSU starter Anthony Eyanson when No. 9 batter Wells Sykes hit his fourth homer of the season. That brought on Chase Shores for his fourth appearance of the CWS. The 6-foot-8 right-hander touched 100 mph with his fastball while retiring the first five batters he faced before Dean Mihos, who homered in the second, singled through the right side leading off the ninth. With Tigers fans on their feet and chanting “L-S-U, L-S-U,” Shores struck out

Ty Dooley and got Sykes to ground into a game-ending double play. The Tigers’ dugout emptied and the celebratory dogpile behind the mound ensued. The

87-year-old Bertman came onto the field in a wheelchair and walked with assistance to have pictures taken with coaches and players. The Chanticleers had won

15 straight when Morrison (12-1) started. Morrison’s 3 2⁄3 innings marked his shortest start of the season and the five runs against him were the most he has allowed.

LSU entered having won 13 games in a row in which one of its top two pitchers — Kade Anderson and Eyanson — started. Anderson was selected the Most Outstanding Player of the CWS after allowing one run and six hits and striking out 17 in 16 innings over two starts in Omaha. Anderson threw a three-hit shutout in LSU’s 1-0 win in Game 1 of the finals, and Eyanson (12-2) was mostly sharp over his 6 ½ innings. The three runs against him came on seven hits and a walk. He struck out nine. Schnall, in his first year as head coach after taking over for the retired Gary Gilmore, had not been ejected this season before Sunday. Walker Mitchell was at bat with two outs and Sebastian Alexander had just stolen second base when Schnall went to the top steps of the dugout, gestured at plate umpire Angel Campos with three fingers and began shouting at him. The NCAA said Schnall was arguing balls and strikes, was given a warning and thrown out when he did not leave immediately. Schilling was tossed for comments he made as the confrontation with umpires continued near the plate.

sometimes.” Russell came from six points down to win against Chapmanville in the Red Devils’ first two-quarter scrimmage. “They’re a pretty good team,” Ryder said of the Tigers. “Our defense really stepped up.” Joda said seeing his son on the Henderson Center court brought back a flood of memories, especially with Jody in the stands, former teammates Corny Jackson and Tamar Slay watching, and Slay’s son and incoming Thundering Herd freshman Bryce running the clock. Jackson is Marshall’s coach. “It’s really a lot of flashbacks from when my dad coached me,” Joda said. “When you’re a player and your dad coaches you, it repeats itself sometimes. It’s a little nostalgic, kind of strange. I played here for four years, four of the best years of my life. It helped me get where I am today. To see him step out here on the floor and know I was here 25 years ago is pretty cool.”

Joda said Ryder needs to continue to improve. “I feel like we have a good team,” Joda said. “We’re still a little bit young. He fits in well. He shoots the ball well and sees the floor. “Getting him to be a little more aggressive is the shortcoming of his game right now. He’s going to continue to grow and get bigger. His basketball IQ is pretty high. I’m proud of him for that.” Jody chimed in about the IQ. “He gets that from me,” he said with a laugh. Joda said the Red Devils will play at a quicker pace next season, and Ryder will be key in making that happen. Ryder said he relishes the opportunity. “I’m going to try to become a leader of the team and hope to become a good leader,”

Ryder said. “I want to help us have a good season this year. We have a chance to win the 16th Region this year if we play well.” Joda said fishing, friends and family, especially twin sister Reagan, are priorities for him off the court. Russell coach Derek Cooksey said it’s good for players to relax a bit. “Ryder works tremendously hard and puts a lot of pressure on himself,” Cooksey said. “He

had a really good freshman season. There are a lot of expectations for him and all of our sophomores to progress and mature.” Cooksey said he looks forward to seeing Ryder develop. “I can’t say enough about him,” Cooksey said. “He’s one of the better players and scorers for his age division coming up. I’ve really challenged him defensively and that’s starting to come. He’s a big part of our program.”
