



Oct. trial

CATLETTSBURG Boyd County Circuit Court Judge John Vincent made it clear he planned for a double murder case to stay on track for an October trial during court Thursday.

"You all agreed to the date and now you object," Vincent told Sebastian Joy, who is representing suspect John F. Tooson. "This case has been continued far too many times.

Tooson, 35, of Rossford, Ohio, was indicted in July 2022 on two murder counts, auto theft, wanton endangerment and possession of a handgun by a convicted felon.

Tooson is accused of killing Summer Algarakhuly, 18, and Selina Easter, 20, on June 17, 2022 in East Ashland. According to police, Tooson fled to Toledo in Easter's car and was in a six-hour-long standoff with police before shooting himself.

Joy's office made a motion to delay the trial. Enhanced audio from video was the cause for the motion. The video was analyzed by Kentucky State Police Det. John Vaughn and the audio was enhanced, Joy said.

"The issue is what has been deciphered using scientific enhancement," Joy said. "The audio is not decipherable to the lay person."

Joy said the experts his office uses have been unable to reproduce the findings in Vaughn's reports and so far he has not been able to find any expert who can.

Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Kristen Rosen argued with around 40 days until the trial is set to start there should be time for

Joy to be able to find an expert. Vincent pointed out Joy's office has also filed a "Daubert hearing" on Vaughn's report. A Daubert hearing is where the judge deter-

The trial remains set to begin in October. Tooson has been in Boyd County Detention Center since July 22, 2022. He appeared via video conference during Thursday's hearing.

November hearing set for murder suspects

GREENUP Court officials did not bring murder suspects Christopher "Clay" Stiltner and Rachel Waddell from the jail on Thursday, but their attorneys and the Commonwealth agreed to the next court date.

Stiltner and Waddell are charged in the murder of 5-year-

old Aubrey Stowers, Waddell's daughter. Aubrey died in June Both co-defendants were in-

dicted on additional charges fentanyl and anabolic steroid possession.

They were on the docket for pretrial conferences for all of the charges Thursday in Greenup County Circuit Court.

Assistant Commonwealth's At-

tornev David Flatt said both sides were trying to get mediation set.

Stiltner and Waddell are both on the docket for a status hearing on Thursday, Nov. 13.

Both remain in the Greenup County Detention Center. They were initially charged with murder in January 2024.

William Simmons is charged in a stabbing at the Winchester Inn on July 21, 2024, and a stabbing in the 300 block of 24th Street on Aug. 14, 2024. He will go to court for action after his incarceration for those events.

Boyd Circuit Judge John Vincent set March 16 as the start of a trial for seven counts of

third-degree assault on a

correctional officer. Simmons is charged with assaulting four separate correctional employees on Aug. 17,

A pretrial conference is set for his other cases on Oct. 30.

Vincent reminded the prosecution and the defense that separate juries would be required if all the cases go to trail, which in turn would lengthen the time required for Simmons to have all his days in court.
