BG company supporting fitness during pregnancy gets grant

A Bowling Green-based company providing physical activity guidance during and after pregnancy is one of eight Kentucky businesses to recently earn grants to support their work.

BumptUp Labs offers an app featuring exercise videos for those who are pregnant or postpartum to improve health outcomes - the focus being evidence-based fitness, according to company CEO Rachel Tinius.

The goal is to improve health outcomes for pregnant and postpartum women, which is especially important in Kentucky, where morbidity-mortality rates are significantly higher than the national average, Tinius said.

Launched in 2022, the company has reached about 1,000 users, around three-quarters in the Bowling Green area, she said.

It became eligible for a \$295,000 Small Business Innovation Research grant after the National Institutes of Health scored it within the top 20% among grant applicants nationwide - allowing Tinius to hire a research coordinator and chief technology officer. Then, the state on July 10 announced it as one of eight Kentucky companies statewide to

receive matching funds - for BumptUp Labs, \$75,000,

which enables Tinius to keep partum women they needthe positions, one full time and the other a fractional position, for around another year.

... I'm doing this kind of adventurous thing and going out on a limb to do this and, the state is supporting it like they believe in me," she said. "That's a really nice feeling.

To not have to lose anybody and to keep us intact for a solid year (...) is really helpful."

Grant funds will also support other areas of the business, from keeping the app up to date, to traveling for the purpose of broaden outreach.

The idea came as she conducted research at WKU and realized that doctors were telling pregnant and post-

ed to be more active and healthier - and they wanted to but didn't know where to she said.

acquire information. Generally speaking, even if people were not pretty motivated before, they become motivated a lot of the times when they're pregnant because it's not just about themselves anymore - so, you've got this need," Tinius said.

... we needed a digital tool that does not exist,' she said. "Rather than wait for someone else to do it, I decided to do it.'

All app content – every exercise, every video - is vetted by physical activity experts, obstetricians and physical therapists; between two of the latter, one has certification in women's health, while the other, a recent graduate, intends to acquire that additional certification,

Most exercises came from Tinius - an exercise physiologist and an associate professor at Western Kentucky University's exercise science department - and all are performed by pregnant women, overseen by a physical therapist to ensure correctness, under the purview of a research coordinator who's a licensed physical therapist and clinician, and reviewed by two of the company's board obstetricians.

"I really have a strong desire to better the lives of people in our community and beyond, so that really drove me to make the decision to go for it," Tinius said.
