auditor also noted no matters involving internal control over financial reporting and its operation that were considered to be material weaknesses. Auditing standards require the auditor to communicate

whether the financial statement presents fairly the receipts, disbursements and excess fees of the Pendleton County sheriff in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The sheriff's financial statement did not follow this

format. However, the sheriff's financial statement is fairly presented in conformity with the regulatory basis of accounting, which is an acceptable reporting methodology, according to Ball. This reporting methodology is followed for all 120 sheriff audits in Kentucky. The sheriff's responsibilities include collecting property taxes, providing law enforcement, and performing services
