BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF WARSAW, IN GALLATIN COUN-TY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1: Section 51.166 of the Warsaw Code of Ordinances is hereby amended

§ 51.166 Connections of Surface Runoff or Groundwater Sources Prohibited; Storm Sewer Connection Fee.

A. No person or public corpora tion shall make connection of roof downspouts, exterior or interior foundation drains, areaway drains, Driveway, Parking Lot or Street Drains, or other sources of surface runoff, Storm Water or groundwater (Storm Water') to a building sewer or building drain which in turn is connected directly or indirectly to a public sanitary sewer.

B. All Such Storm Water Shall be Connected and Discharged to the City Storm Water Collection System, if Available; and if not, to a Natural Drainage Course.

C. Any Person, Firm, Corporation, Builder, Developer or Homeowner Who Connects Such ('Storm Water') for Discharge into the City Storm Water Collection System Shall Pay a Tap-On Fee to the City as Follows: 1. Up to and Including Twelve Inch

(12") Pipe - Five Hundred (\$500.00) 2. Larger than 12" up to and In-

cluding Twenty-Four Inch (24") Pipe - One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars; 3. Larger than 24" up to and In-

cluding Thirty-Six Inch (36") Pipe -Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars; or 4. Larger than 36" - Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars.
