Public Notice Regarding Confidentiality and Child Find for Children with Disabilities in Need of Special Education, 504 Services, or Preschool Services

Child Find

Gallatin County Schools keeps education records in a secure location in each school and Board office.

Gallatin County Schools obtains written consent from a parent or eligible student (age 18 or who is attending a postsecondary institution) before disclosing personally identifiable information to an entity or individual not authorized to receive it under FERPA.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Gallatin County Schools may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request three years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. Gallatin County Schools may retain, for an indefinite period of time, a record of the student's name, address, telephone number, grades, attendance records, classes attended, grade level completed, and year completed.

Children eligible for Special Education include those with disabilities who have autism, deaf-blindness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment, and who, because of such an impairment, need Special Education services.

Children eligible for 504 services include those children in a public elementary and secondary education program who have a current physical or mental impairment that currently substantially limits some major life activity, which causes the student's ability to access the school environment or school activities to be substantially limited.

Preschool children eligible for special education must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP) instead of a 504 plan to receive State-Funded Preschool program services. Gallatin County Schools has an ongoing "Child Find" system, which is designed to locate, identify, and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence within its geographical boundaries, age 3-21 years, who may have a disability and require Special Education or 504 services. This includes children who are not in school; those who are in public, private, or home school; those who are highly mobile, such as children who are migrant or homeless; and those who are advancing from grade to grade, who may need but are not receiving Special Education or 504 services.

Gallatin County Schools' "Child Find" system includes children with disabilities attending private or home schools within the school district boundaries who may need special education services.

Gallatin County Schools will make sure any child enrolled in its district who qualifies for Special Education or 504 services, regardless of how severe the disability, is provided appropriate Special Education or 504 services at no cost to the parents of the child.

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens are urged to help Gallatin County Schools find any child who may have a disability and Special Education or 504 services. The District needs to know the name and age, or date of birth, of the child; the name, address, and phone number(s) of the parents or guardian; the possible disability; and other information to determine if Special Education and 504 services are needed.

Letters and phone calls are some of the ways Gallatin County Schools collects the information needed. The information the school district collects will be used to contact the parents of the child and find out if the child needs to be evaluated or referred for Special Education or 504 services.

If you know of a child who lives within the boundaries of Gallatin County Schools who may have a disability and may need but is not receiving Special Education or 504 services, please call 859-567-1823 or send the information to Nicole Bishop, Director of Special Education, Gallatin County Schools, 75 Boardwalk, Warsaw, KY 41095.

"Child Find" activities will continue throughout the school year. As a part of these efforts, Gallatin County Schools will use screening information, student records, and basic assessment information it collects on all children in the district to help locate those children who have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. Any information the district collects through "Child Find" is maintained confidentially.

Written Policies and Procedures have been developed which describe the district's requirements regarding the confidentiality of person-

ally identifiable information and "Child Find" activities. There are copies in the Board of Education office.

Gallatin County Schools provides a public notice in the native language or other mode of communication of the various populations in the geographical boundaries of the district to the extent feasible. If you know of someone who may need this notice translated to another language, given orally, or delivered in some other manner or mode of communication, please contact the Director of Special Education at the address or phone number listed above for Gallatin County Schools.
