A new mural in downtown Georgetown was completed over the weekend, artist Alexandrea Pangburn said.

Pangburn, a full-time artist from Lexington, started doing large-scale spray paint murals in 2018, she said.

"I've always loved art and always been into it, but I really love painting large-scale, and to be able to get the opportunity to paint in a public realm has been

really cool," Pangburn said. "It's really fun to connect with the community in that way. That's probably my favorite part about it."

After spending eight years in Denver, much of Panburn's work can be found in Colorado, she said, but she's painted murals all over the United States.

"I have a lot of murals in Colorado, but I have a mural just outside of Atlanta, GA, in Chamblee," Pangburn said. "Then, I've also painted
