The Board hereby confirms the necessity of the Series 2023A Bonds and hereby declares the necessity of each of the New Projects as required by Section Projects as required by Section 66.101 of the General Obligation

Section 3. Amendment of Definition of Project in Series 2023A Bond Ordinance. The definition of "Project" in the Series 2023A Bond Ordinance is

TELEPHONE SERVICE, DIVISION 2. 911 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE, SEC. 23-143 - "911" FEE ORDINANCES, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HENDERSON WHEREAS, the operation of a 911 or emergency communication. 911 or emergency communica-tions system is one of the most critical of all public services,

tions system is one of the most critical of all public services, indispensable and necessary for the safety of the citizens of the City of Henderson and ensuring prompt responses to emergencies, and WHEREAS, the City of Henderson, pursuant to KRS 65.760 and by interlocal governmental agreement with the Henderson County Fiscal Court, established 911 Communications as a public safety answering point (PSAP), with both entities obligated to fund the cost of its operations pursuant to Ordinance No. 23-19, and the City's portion of said funding being seventy-five percent (75%); and WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statute (KRS) 65.760 is a specific provision wherein the General Assembly expressly permits local governments to fund 911 emergency services by the imposition of a dedicated fee, more particularly: "The funds required ... to establish and operate 911 emergency telephone service ... may be obtained through the levy of any ... fee not in conflict with the Constitution and Statutes of this state," and WHEREAS, the City of Henderson seeks to support the present and future operations

WHEREAS, the City of Henderson seeks to support the present and future operations of the Henderson Emergency Communications Center; and WHEREAS, enhancements to the 911 system are essential to maintain public safety opera-tions and ensure an accurate and timely response for the safety of our citizens; and WHEREAS, to ensure the equi-

table assessment of this fee, the City finds it necessary to transition from billing the dedi-cated 911 fees through Hender-son Water Utility water meter accounts to assessing the fee on utility accounts for any occupied unit receiving gas, electric, water, or sewer

occupied unit receiving gas, electric, water, or sewer service.
