Henderson SportsPlex is

bance for the residents  
surrounding these parks; and  
WHEREAS, the City of  
Henderson deems it necessary  
to establish hours for  
Deaconess Henderson Sport-  
sPlex as it is a similarly situ-  
ated city park.  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT  
ORDAINED by the City of  
Henderson, Kentucky, that Sec.  
17-7-Closing Times for Rev.  
Anthony Brooks Park, Commu-  
nity Park, East End Park,  
Kimmel Park, and Play-  
grounds in all City Parks  
Except During Special Events,  
is hereby amended to include  
Deaconess Henderson Sport-  
sPlex in Chapter 17-Parks and  
Recreation, Article I- In  
General, of the Code of Ordi-  
nances of the City of Hender-  
son, a copy of which is  
attached as Exhibit "A" and  
can be found in the office of the  
city clerk.  
All ordinances or parts of ordi-  
nances in conflict herewith are  
hereby repealed and super-  
seded to the extent of such  
conflict.  
The ordinance shall become  
effective upon legal adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 16-25  
AN ORDINANCE OF THE  
CITY OF HENDERSON,  
KENTUCKY AMENDING  
THE DEFINITION OF  
"PROJECT" IN THE ORDI-  
NANCE OF THE CITY  
DATED NOVEMBER 22, 2022,  
TO PERMIT THE PROCEEDS  
OF THE CITY'S GENERAL  
OBLIGATION BONDS,  
SERIES 2023A TO BE SPENT  
FOR COSTS OF OTHER  
PUBLIC PROJECTS  
WITNESSETH:  
WHEREAS, on November 22,  
2022, the Board of Commis-  
sioners (the "Board") of the City  
of Henderson, Kentucky (the  
"City") enacted Ordinance 34-  
22 (the "Bond Ordinance") that  
authorized the issuance of the  
City of Henderson, Kentucky  
General Obligation Bonds,  
Series 2023A (the "Series 2023A  
Bonds") for the purposes of (a)  
financing the costs of acquir-  
ing, constructing, equipping,  
and installing (i) a "Fiber to  
Home" infrastructure system  
to provide fiber, internet, and  
voice services to customers of  
the City's existing fiber optic

network; (ii) an Advanced  
Metering Infrastructure  
system for monitoring and  
metering the distribution of  
electricity related to the elec-  
tric light, heat, power plant,  
and distribution facilities of the  
City; and (iii) the conversion  
of certain existing above  
ground electrical facilities to  
underground electrical facili-  
ties (collectively, the "Initial  
Project"); and (b) paying  
costs of issuance of the Series  
2023A Bonds; and  
WHEREAS, the City has  
proceeds of the Series 2023A  
Bonds remaining after substan-  
tially completing and paying  
the costs of the Original  
Project; and  
WHEREAS, the Board desires  
to amend the definition of  
"Project" within the Bond  
Ordinance to permit the City to  
expand the remaining proceeds  
of the Series 2023A Bonds for  
other public projects of the  
City, which would have other-  
wise originally qualified for  
financing with use of the  
proceeds of the Series 2023A  
Bonds under Sections 66.011 et.  
seq. of the Kentucky Revised  
Statutes, as amended (the  
"General Obligation Act"),  
including all or a portion of the  
following:  
(i) the costs of the acquisition,  
construction, installation and  
equipping of substation  
improvements and renova-  
tions;  
(ii) the costs of the City's  
share of the 2024 Midcontinent  
Independent System Operator  
(MISO) Transmission Expans-  
ion Plan (MTEP24) improve-  
ments and renovations; and  
(iii) the costs of the replace-  
ment of transmission and  
distribution poles and related  
equipment (collectively, the  
"New Projects");  
WHEREAS, the amendment of  
the definition of "Project"  
within the Bond Ordinance  
does not require the consent of  
holders of the Series 2023A  
Bonds, but will promote trans-  
parency by the City in its  
application of the proceeds of  
the Series 2023A Bonds to the  
New Projects;  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT  
ORDAINED by the City of  
Henderson, Kentucky, as  
follows:  
Section 1. Affirmation and  
Incorporation of Preamble.  
The facts and statements  
contained in the foregoing  
preamble of this Ordinance,  
including the terms defined  
therein, are hereby affirmed  
and incorporated as a part of  
this Ordinance.  
Section 2. Declaration of Public  
Purpose and Necessity. The  
Board hereby declares each of  
the New Projects to be public  
projects engaged in by the City  
for public purposes under the  
General Obligation Act. The  
Board hereby confirms the  
necessity of the Series 2023A  
Bonds and hereby declares the  
necessity of each of the New  
Projects as required by Section  
66.101 of the General Obligation  
Act.

Section 3. Amendment of Defi-  
nition of Project in Series  
2023A Bond Ordinance. The  
definition of "Project" in the  
Series 2023A Bond Ordinance is  
hereby amended and restated  
in its entirety as follows:  
"Project" means the acquisi-  
tion, construction, installation,  
and equipping by the City of  
each of the following:  
(i) a "Fiber to Home" infra-  
structure system to provide  
fiber internet and voice  
services to customers of the  
System (as defined in the Bond  
Ordinance);  
(ii) an Advanced Metering  
Infrastructure system for the  
System;  
(iii) the conversion of certain  
existing above ground electri-  
cal facilities to underground  
electrical facilities; and  
(iv) substation improvements  
and renovations;  
(v) the City's share of the 2024  
Midcontinent Independent  
System Operator (MISO)  
Transmission Expansion Plan  
(MTEP24) improvements and  
renovations; and  
(vi) the replacement of trans-  
mission and distribution poles  
and related equipment.  
Section 4. Further Actions. In  
connection with the undertak-  
ing and implementation by the  
City of the amendment herein  
described, which is hereby  
expressly directed, the Design-  
ated Officers of the City (as  
defined in the Bond Ordinance)  
are hereby authorized and  
directed to take and carry out  
such further necessary, desir-  
able, or appropriate actions to  
effect such amendment.  
Section 5. Severability. If any  
one or more of the provisions  
of this Ordinance should be  
determined by a court of  
competent jurisdiction to be  
contrary to law, then such  
provisions shall be deemed to  
be severable from all remain-  
ing provisions and shall not  
affect the validity of such other  
provisions.  
Section 6. Inconsistent Actions.  
All prior ordinances, resolu-  
tions, orders, or parts thereof  
inconsistent herewith are  
hereby repealed. The Bond  
Ordinance, except to the extent  
otherwise amended herein, is  
hereby affirmed.  
Section 7. Open Meetings  
Compliance. All meetings of  
the Board and of its commit-  
tees and any other public  
bodies, at which the formal  
actions in connection with this  
Ordinance, or at which deliber-  
ations that resulted in such  
formal actions were held, were  
open meetings, and such  
formal actions were taken and  
any such deliberations took  
place while such meetings,  
after proper notice, were open  
to the public, in compliance  
with all legal requirements  
including KRS Sections 61.805  
through 61.850.  
Section 8. Effective Date. This  
Ordinance shall become effec-  
tive immediately upon adop-  
tion and publication of a  
summary thereof, as provided  
by law.

SUMMARY: ORDINANCE  
AMENDING CHAPTER 23,  
UTILITIES, ARTICLE VII.  
TELEPHONE SERVICE,  
DIVISION 2. 911 EMER-  
GENCY TELEPHONE  
SERVICE, SEC. 23-143 - "911"  
FEE ORDINANCES, OF THE  
CODE OF ORDINANCES OF  
THE CITY OF HENDERSON  
WHEREAS, the operation of a  
911 or emergency communi-  
cations system is one of the most  
critical of all public services,  
indispensable and necessary  
for the safety of the citizens of  
the City of Henderson and  
ensuring prompt responses to  
emergencies; and  
WHEREAS, the City of  
Henderson, pursuant to KRS  
65.760 and by interlocal govern-  
mental agreement with the  
Henderson County Fiscal  
Court, established 911 Commu-  
nications as a public safety  
answering point (PSAP), with  
both entities obligated to fund  
the cost of its operations  
pursuant to Ordinance No. 23-  
19, and the City's portion of  
said funding being seventy-five  
percent (75%); and  
WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised  
Statute (KRS) 65.760 is a  
specific provision wherein the  
General Assembly expressly  
permits local governments to  
fund 911 emergency services  
by the imposition of a dedi-  
cated fee, more particularly:  
"The funds required ... to  
establish and operate 911 emer-  
gency telephone service ...  
may be obtained through the  
levy of any ... fee not in  
conflict with the Constitution  
and Statutes of this state," and  
WHEREAS, the City of  
Henderson seeks to support the  
present and future operations  
of the Henderson Emergency  
Communications Center; and  
WHEREAS, enhancements to  
the 911 system are essential to  
maintain public safety opera-  
tions and ensure an accurate  
and timely response for the  
safety of our citizens; and  
WHEREAS, to ensure the equi-  
table assessment of this fee,  
the City finds it necessary to  
transition from billing the dedi-  
cated 911 fees through Hender-  
son Water Utility water meter  
accounts to assessing the fee  
on utility accounts for any  
occupied unit receiving gas,  
electric, water, or sewer  
service.  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT  
ORDAINED by the City of  
Henderson, Kentucky, that  
Chapter 23, Utilities, Article  
VII. Telephone Service, Divi-  
sion 2. 911 Emergency Tele-  
phone Service, Sec. 23-143 -  
"911" Fee Ordinances, of the  
Code of Ordinances of the City  
of Henderson, is hereby  
amended, a copy of which is  
attached as Exhibit "A" and  
can be found in the office of the
