Dora Bell Bibb Calhoun was brought home and laid to rest in the Old Community Cemetery just outside of Greensburg.

Alfred Calhoun died on March 16, 1932, at his home. He had been one of only three surviving Civil War veterans left in the county. He was laid to rest by Dora's side in the Old

Community Cemetery. Despite the hardships and challenges they undoubtedly faced, Dora and Alfred built a life together grounded in resilience and hope. Their union marked the beginning of a new chapter, not just for themselves, perseverance.
