Clark Casual Fur-Greensburg was established by Billy Gene Clark in 1960 Farm Family of and continued as a thriving business for several decades.

Upon returning to Green County, Clark started his company Thurlow, Lurlia in the back room of a and making furniture there. More employees were hired as the business expanded

workers. At the time, there were 32 people working in five departments:office,construction shop, sewing room, finishing room, and shipping.

Clark Casual produced beautiful, high-quality furniture made of strong and durable rattan wood shipped here from the Philippines. It was the only company in the United States that started with raw rattan and created a finished product. They shipped furniture to customers across the entire United States.

As business boomed, a 13,500 square feet addition to the manufactur-

ing facility was constructed in late 1975.

By 1977, the number of employees at Clark Casual had grown to 103. There were 112 by 1983. The company hosted annual picnics for its workers and presented awards to recognize those with 5 or more years of service.

In 1994, longtime plant manager Mike Huddleston purchased Clark Casual Furniture. He started with the company in 1964 as an accountant in the office and served in various administrative positions before being promoted to executive vice president in 1979.

After many years in operation, Clark Casual Furniture closed its doors, and the building was sold in December 2002. Furniture manufactured there can still be found in many Green County homes, as well as around the country.

The City of Greensburg, Kentucky, is requesting proposals from professional Roadway Design firms including those with Conditional Approval for Small Roadway Design for the purpose of providing Construction Inspection Services for pedestrian and bicycle facilities located along various routes in Greensburg, Kentucky.

A construction inspector must inspect the contractor's work on the project pursuant to the inspection plan. These inspections ensure that the project is well built, compliant with the construction specifications, and that the LPA is getting a good value from the contractor.
