The Greensburg City Council, in a special called meeting Monday, July 28, approved the first reading of Property Tax Rate Ordinance No. 2025-0818. The Council voted to keep the 2025 real and personal property tax rate the same as the 2024 tax rate of 23.8 cents per \$100 of assessed
