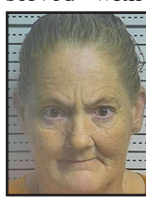

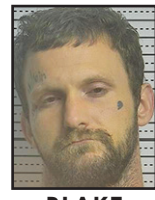

- Frederick J. Blake, 30, of Salvisa, was arrested and charged with promoting human trafficking—victim under 18 years of age. According to the uniform citation, the

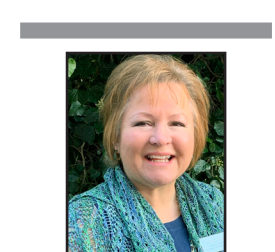
