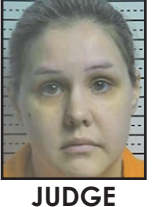

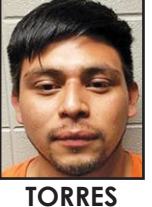

Mercer farmers receive state funding

Thompson Family Farm LLC of Salvisa was approved up to \$13,840 in Mercer County funds to set up a sheep buying station at the farm. For more information about Thompson Family Farm, visit tfamilyfarms.com.

The Kentucky Agricultural Development Board approved more than \$3.3 million in funding for agricultural diversification and rural development projects across the Commonwealth today at its monthly board meet-

ing.

In addition, \$182,220 in funding for Mercer County from the County Agricultural Incentives Program was announced.

The program provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. Funding covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in 11 incentive areas, including beef and dairy cattle; farm infrastructure, fence-

ing, and water enhancement; equine; forage; goats and sheep; horticulture; poultry; swine; bees and honey; timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production; marketing; and value-added production.

Twenty-two County Agricultural Incentives were approved, totaling more than \$2.8 million.
