# Relay for Life Fundraisers lead up to September event

Support continues to grow for this year's Boyle-Mercer County Relay for Life, with several community fund-raisers scheduled throughout August leading up to the main event on Friday, Sept. 13.

**August 9:** Paint Parties / Designs by Stein will host a paint party fundraiser at The Sandwich Shop in Harrodsburg starting at 1 p.m. The cost is \$30 to participate, with \$10 from each registration donated to Relay for Life. Sign-up links are available in several local Facebook groups, on the Boyle-Mercer County Relay for Life business page, and in person at The Sandwich Shop.

**August 16:** Blackbird Café will host a Dine to Donate from 6 to 9 p.m., donating 10% of sales to Relay for Life during that

been part of the original site plan.

"It hasn't been put in yet," McGlone said. "If they're not going to do it according to plans, I don't see how we can approve another building."

Wise said the amount of impervious surface at the building site had not changed.

McGlone said other applicants followed the commission's recommendations.

"There's no need for us to approve something if it's not enforced," McGlone said. Bobby Upchurch, chairman of the planning and zoning commission, noted the applicant needed a building permit. Upchurch said they could direct Building Inspector David Coleman not to approve the permit until the applicant builds the detention basin.

"It's good practice to put

the detention basin in prior to construction," Upchurch said.

"It can be kind of swampy down there," Wise said. "In terms of effectiveness, it's not going to do a whole lot."

"It would get out, but it would be slow," Upchurch said.

All the necessary signatures had been collected. McGlone moved to approve the amended site plan, contingent on the building inspector not issuing a permit until the detention basin had been built. Commissioner Jerry Catlett seconded McGlone's motion, which passed unanimously.

In other business, the commission postponed a vote on a final plat to construct 10 residential buildings on Skyline Drive until the applicant resubmitted the plan.

They also approved

advertising for an administrative assistant.

The commission had previously advertised for an administrative assistant and received one application. They did not make a hire at the time. They will advertise for two weeks. If hired, the successful applicant would receive a salary of up to \$18 an hour, depending on qualifications.

Finally, board members Lucas Guinn and Jerry Catlett volunteered to serve with Chairman Upchurch on an ordinance committee. Last week, the Mercer County Fiscal Court voted to relax lot size restrictions for exemptions for noise from agricultural production. Even after some residents spoke against voting to ease the restrictions, the fiscal court voted unanimously to exempt noise on all property zoned agriculture—A-1, A-2 and A-3—regardless of

lot size.

At Friday's planning and zoning meeting, it was noted that the fiscal court had also reduced the minimum lot size for agriculture from five acres to 2.5 acres. However, the ordinances still specified a five-acre lot size.

"It should be cleaned up," said Planning and Zoning Executive Director Kylie Donnelly. Donnelly suggested striking that language, among other things.

Any changes recommended by the ordinance committee would require a public hearing. The committee will meet on Friday, Aug. 8, and Friday, Aug. 29, at 9 a.m. They hope to hold a public hearing on Friday, Sept. 5.

The next meeting of the Harrodsburg-Mercer County Joint Planning and Zoning Commission will be Friday, Sept. 5, at 9 a.m.
