Kentucky State Police Post 7 welcomes new commander



FELDER

The Kentucky State Police Richmond Post 7, whose territory includes Mercer County, welcomes Capt. Scott Felder as the new. Felder is a 20-year veteran of the Kentucky State Police.

Felder began his career on July 17,

2005, and graduated the Kentucky State Police Academy in December 2005. After graduation, he served at Post 7-Richmond as a trooper until August 2012. On August 16, 2012 Felder was promoted to sergeant and served at Post 12-Frankfort. On May 1, 2015, he was promoted to lieutenant and was transferred to Post 14-Ashland. There he served as the investigative lieutenant in charge of the detectives. On Sept. 1, 2015, Felder transferred to Post 11- London, continuing to serve as the investigative lieutenant. On Jan. 16, 2017, Felder was transferred to his

home, Post 7-Richmond, where he served as the operations lieutenant in charge of the uniformed troopers. On Sept. 1, 2018, Felder promoted to captain and was the commander of the Criminal Identification and Records Branch as well as the Computer Technologies Branch. On March 1, 2020, Felder was transferred to the Inspections and Evaluations Branch. Almost immediately, he was assigned to Gov. Andy Beshear's COVID-19 response team for the State of Kentucky. In that capacity, Felder travelled the state in an effort to set up drive-thru test-

ing sites. Working with local law enforcement, Emergency Medical Services, Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, local Emergency Management directors and Kentucky National Guardsmen, Felder would complete operational plans and ensure the site was accessible to the public with minimal impact to surrounding businesses and traffic patterns. On Sept. 1, 2020, Felder was transferred to Post 11-London as the post commander where he remained until being assigned to Dry Ridge as the post commander on Sept. 1, 2021. Felder remained at Dry Ridge Post until

he became the ommander of Internal Affairs on October 1, 2023, where he remained until being assigned to Richmond Post.

Felder is the recipient of several awards to include seat belt occupant safety, two Commissioners Commendations and the Lifesaving Medal.

A former Georgia resident, Felder grew up in Rincon, Georgia, and graduated from Effingham County High School in 1988. In June of 1988, Felder entered the United States Marine Corps and went to boot camp at Parris Island in South Carolina. Upon gradu-

ation, Felder was stationed at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina where his primary job was a landing support specialist. He was also a reserve military police officer at Camp Lejeune. In August 1990, Felder's unit deployed to the Persian Gulf in support of Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

After his enlistment in the Marine Corps, Felder moved to Winchester, Kentucky, in 1994. There he worked at the Winchester Public Works and then was employed as a Winchester firefighter and emergency medical technician. In 2004, Felder was accepted to

the Lifenet Paramedic program and graduated in May 2005, before his acceptance to the Kentucky State Police Academy.

Felder is grateful for the opportunity to come back to his community and serve the eleven counties which make up Richmond Post. Having worked in all 11 counties at some point in his career as a trooper, Felder looks forward to rekindling and building new relationships with local law enforcement, community leaders and the general public alike.

Felder is married to Debra Bowling of Richmond. They have three children.

Ephraim relocated behavior health to new offices

Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center announces that it is relocating its inpatient Behavioral Health Unit to a newly-renovated space on the fifth floor of the Johnson Tower, which houses other patient care units. The unit has been housed in the hospital's North Wing, which will be razed in the near future to provide space for Ephraim McDowell's expansion project. The new unit is anticipated to open on Aug. 4.

"We are excited to move our inpatient Behavioral Health Unit to a newly-renovated

space in the patient care tower," said Travis Thatcher-Curtis, assistant chief nursing officer at Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center. "The new location will offer a modernized environment with more spacious areas for our patients."

The inpatient Behavioral Health Unit provides short-term treatment to adults age 18 and older for a variety of behavioral health diagnoses. Specialized services for geriatric behavioral health needs are also offered to patients age 65 and older.

The unit uses a multidisciplinary approach to provide treatment, which involves physicians, advanced practice providers, licensed nurses, mental health technicians, counselors, social workers, activity therapists, intake coordinators and discharge planners. The unit uses a combination of medication, group therapy, individual counseling, and other therapeutic activities that are individualized to each patient in order to help them achieve their goals for treatment.

Programming on the unit also includes tai-

lored treatment with the aim of setting individual goals and providing tools and strategies to help empower patients to achieve their goals.

The new unit is a locked unit that will offer a therapeutic and controlled environment with space allocated for group therapies, quiet activities and socialization. The new unit will have a total of 15 beds, and five of the patient rooms will be double occupancy.

The hospital hosted a ribbon-cutting and open house on the new unit on July 16.
