### ORDINANCE 04-202 FY25 ANNUAL BUDGET CITY OF MUNFORDVILLE

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MUNFORDVILLE, KENTUCKY, ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2024, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2025, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND APPROPRIATIONS.**

**WHEREAS**, an annual budget proposal and message have been prepared and delivered to the legislative body for review and modification.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED** BY THE CITY OF MUNFORDVILLE

Section 1: That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, is hereby adopted as shown in Exhibit A, Attached.

Section 2: That this Ordinance shall be in effect upon passage and publication.
