the competition alongside two of her Kentucky sister queens, Harper Gearlds and Lydia Koesters, both of Bowling Green. Lydia did further advance to second runner up.

When she was not competing, Carlee participated in the meet and greet with the other contestants, swam, and went to the poolpalooza - all Universal Miss sponsored events. One day, while on an excursion to Ft. Worth Stockyard to watch the Longhorn Stampede, she met actor Billy Bob Thornton who was filming season 2 of "Landman".

Since winning the title of East South Central Pre-Teen in February, Carlee had been preparing for nationals and spreading her platform Carlee's Cars and Crowns, bringing awareness and happiness to children at Kentucky Children's Hospital and Shriner's of Lexington. Carlee said she established her platform after being diagnosed with scoliosis and having to see the orthopedic surgeon twice a year.

"I realized that waiting for a doctor can cause anxiety and boredom among young patients in the waiting area," Carlee shared. "When I visit, the kids will spend time talking to me about pageants and their interests. The girls are given their very own crown, and the boys are given brand new Hotwheels. Everyone smiles and has a great time."

This past Christmas, Carlee hosted a toy drive and collected \$800 in toys for UK Children's Hospital. In April of this year, she added a site to her service initiative - Heuser Hearing institute and Language Academy - and next year plans to visit St. Jude's with her platform.

"I have found that winning a title is not about the title, but it's about serving others and making a true difference," Carlee said. "Crowns and sashes can do one of two things. They can collect dust or memories. I choose memories."

In addition to pageantry, Carlee loves volleyball and color guard. She is also involved in the Gifted and Talented Program at Caverna Middle School, as well as STLP. Carlee has an older brother, Cooper Briggs, who attends Caverna High School.
