Grants would provide playground shade, pave city parking lot

CAMPBELLSBURG — During the Campbellsburg City Council meeting May 19, Mayor David Gray said the city is applying for grant funding to purchase a shade structure to cover the city playground. It will also see grant funding to blacktop, stripe and install curbing to the city parking lot, which would add 37 spaces. If approved through the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act, the city would fund about \$3,500 of the roughly \$243,000 projects. A public hearing is scheduled for Monday, June 9 to seek comments on the grant applications. The hearing will be held at the Campbellsburg Community Center, 8192 Main St. Gray said Kentucky Fish and Wildlife will put a freezer across from city hall in September for deer hunters to place the

heads of deer they harvest to help fight chronic wasting disease (CWD). Deer season opens Sept. 26 and runs through Jan. 19, 2026. Hunters who place a head in the freezer will be entered into a raffle for a gift package worth up to \$5,000. Gray said he doesn’t want people to think he’s trying to commercialize Campbellsburg. “I just want us to look like a small town, I envision like Vevay,” Gray said. “When you go into Vevay you just have that feel; that’s what I want for us, my town, our town. I want it to have that small town appeal.” “I just want to say that you and everybody here is doing an excellent job moving it that way,” farmer Rich Castradi said to Gray and city council members. “If I wasn’t so happy with my farm, I’d probably move into the city limits.” The next city council meeting will be Monday, June 16 at 7 p.m. at city hall.
