Nicholas Bryan capped off the seven-run inning with a sacrifice fly at the center field wall to bring in Nolin and extend the margin to 7-3.

Henry County's defense limited the Rebels to a pair of walks in the top of the third, as Hortenbury struck out his last two batters to leave runners on second and third.

Both teams were held scoreless in their next trips to the plate until Henry County added to its lead in the bottom of the fourth.

Nolin followed his RBI double in the second inning with a two-run homer over the left field wall to move the lead out to 9-3.

Bryan followed with a double to the center field wall and Peyton drew a walk to give Henry County a chance to extend its lead. However, Owen County secured a pop out in foul territory to thwart the attack and leave the margin at six.

Both teams stood firm defensively to leave the score at 9-3 until the bottom of the sixth inning, when Jaylan Hortenbury led off with a solo homer to right field to push the lead to 10-3.

Later in the frame, Wilson doubled to center field to send home Bryan and put the game further out of reach.

Owen County continued to battle, though, and used an error and a pair of singles from Smith and Trip Allnut to load the bases in the top of the seventh inning.

Yet, Nolin struck out his final batter faced to leave all three runners on board and spark a frenzy of celebrations by the Wildcats.

"They have fought all year and all game today, started out down 3-0, bat-

ted back with 11 runs," said Paris.

Nolin ended with two runs, two hits and five RBI at the plate, along with six strikeouts in four innings on the mound for Henry County.

Hortenbury contributed six strikeouts in three innings pitched as well, and earned a run, a hit and an RBI at the plate.

Bryan, Wilson and Abney tallied a run, a hit and an RBI apiece, and Yates and Peyton finished with a run and a hit each.

For their performances during the tournament, Peyton, Abney, Nolin and Bryan were named to the All-Tournament Team.

With the victory, Henry County moved on to the Eighth Region

Tournament, which began on Sunday, May 25.

Heading into regionals, Paris hoped to see the Wildcats remain composed at the plate and in the field to have a chance at a deep tournament run.

"Keeping everybody's head on straight, making sure nobody's getting too high, too low," Paris said. "Just keeping everybody consistent with the bats because (with) our offense, we'll play good. Just make sure our pitching and defense is on solid ground."
