the way things work. What inspires me is my son and seeing the battles that he went through from the age of about 14-15, and what our family went through,” Short said. “I know that there was nothing then that we could go to as a family. Flash forward to today, there really still isn’t a lot. My son has been my number one motivation. I know the things we went through, the way I felt, the way he felt, how our whole family felt. There’s a lot of other people out here feeling the same way.”

B.A.E, a client at Community Partners for Recovery, wanted to share her story with the public.

B.A.E comes from a place of addiction, homelessness, and crime. Throughout her life, she has had multiple surgeries on the vocal cords due to polyps that grow. She said for several years she was addicted to taking Oxycontin to manage the pain.

“I’ve always had surgeries and been in pain, because I have lots of back issues. I’ve always felt like I needed pills, or I needed something to numb the pain,” B.A.E said. “I didn’t know what else to do, and there weren’t any programs in this town to help anybody except for them (CPR).”

In 2017, B.A.E was released from prison where she served seven years for burglary and robbery. That is where she spiraled into taking Roxy’s. B.A.E said she would snort them and she started doing things she had never done before.

“I’d stayed in Eastern Kentucky for about five, six years, and when I got out of prison, went up there, spiraled, came back. I decided I had my head on my shoulders. You know, I was going to do this thing, get sober. I felt like I didn’t need meds,” B.A.E said. “I felt better when I didn’t take them. When I would take them, ma’am, it felt like I would hurt, like it would make me hurt.”

B.A.E started seeing a therapist at Fuller Health in Bowling Green. This led her to come into contact with Stacy Gordon.

“I was thankful I got led here, that’s why I was like, thank you, Jesus. You know it had to be a God thing, because when I got here and talked to Stacy and met Libby, we had a lot in common,” B.A.E said.

B.A.E still struggles to find independent housing due to her past felonies. She currently stays in sober living and relies on her car.

“I didn’t get approved for the housing that I had originally wanted. I thought I could give my car up and walk to the stores. I was very thankful to have my car. I was trying to build some credit. I got my car,” B.A.E said. “I got a call one day and they’re like, ‘You don’t have to live in your car anymore. You can go stay in sober living’. I met Lesa Booker, sisters in sobriety in Beaumont, Kentucky. That’s one of the best places anybody could ever ask for. I got to meet a lot of great people, a lot of different personalities.”

B.A.E said that Community Partners for Recovery took her in and treated her like she was one of their own. She said that what CPR is doing for the community, people like her will remember. She said it truly is a blessing for people like her.

September is National Recovery Month. Community Partners for Recovery is located at 112B Esminger Drive. Their phone number is (270) 629-2737. CPR is a safe space for those in recovery seeking support, resources, and treatment in Barren County.
