Still, the Wildcats chal-

lenged the Volunteers deep into the shot clock on several offensive possessions, but it was Tennessee’s prowess on the glass that they could not overcome.

“I thought our defensive effort was great,” Kentucky freshman guard Collin Chandler said. “I thought we played really well defensively. It was the second-chance

(points) that they kept getting that just was deflating.”

The Wildcats tried various lineups to thwart Tennessee’s dominance on the glass but to no avail.

In his last appearance with the Wildcats, Butler led Kentucky with 18 points. Butler made four of the team’s six shots from long range.

Amari Williams fol-

lowed Butler with 14 points and Oweh finished with 13.

Zakai Ziegler led Tennessee with 18 points and 10 assists, directing traffic and doing what great point guards do. Butler said Ziegler’s performance was the difference in the game.

“He’s one of the best point guards in the country,” Butler said. “Tonight,

he played well, as he’s been doing all year. Congrats to him and the team for going on further in the tournament.”

Butler kept his head up about his play against Ziegler.

“It’s a great matchup. I felt like I held my own,” he said. “And to go out there and compete, at the end of the day, that’s all I could ask for.”
