revenue sharing for Kentucky counties and cities that returns collected coal and non-coal severance taxes to local government.

Its sewer fund is estimated to have \$335,056 from their enterprise funds and \$50,000 from other revenue sources.

The city has appropriated all of its revenue to expenses for the next fiscal year with the largest portion of funds (\$385,056) going toward the city's sewer systems. The city's general fund expenses are broken down as follows: General Government (\$244,020), Pass Thru Grant (\$180,000), Police (\$88,048), Recreation (\$41,800) and Capital Project (\$30,000).

Road aid appropriations for FY2026 are \$44,951. LGEAF expenses are estimated as \$2,400.

Thursday's meeting was the first reading with the Board holding a second reading and approval at their regular meeting June 19.

New Haven also held a first reading for proposed new sewer rates for its customers. Mayor Linda Mattingly said the rate increase was to ensure they had the funds to continue to upgrade and improve the city's sewer systems. Mattingly said they have to be proactive with the sewage system, especially as they run multiple aerators, which would need to be replaced if broken.

The city proposed the following changes to the sewer rates for customers in the city:

active meter \$20.20, first 2,000 gallons \$31.02 (minimum), next 3,000 gallons (per thousand) \$8.20, next 5,000 gallons (per thousand) \$7.19 and all over 10,000 gallons (per thousand) \$6.74.

For out-of-city customers rates will also be rising. The following are the proposed changes in rates: active meter, no usage \$20.40, First 2,000 gallons \$32.76 (minimum) next 3,000 gallons (per thousand) \$9.06, next ,5000 gallons (per thousand) \$8.54 and all over 10,000 gal. (per thousand) \$8.38.

Additionally, New Haven proposed raising rates on both Log Still and The Abbey of Gethsemane for their sewer services. The rate schedule for Log Still is as follows: customer charge \$2,764.50 minimum per month and volumetric rate \$6.48 per 1,000 gallons.

The rate schedule for The Abbey is as follows: customer charge to \$96.04 minimum per month and volumetric rate to \$6.90 per 1,000 gallons.

The Board held its first reading Thursday for the proposed rate changes. A second reading and possible approval will be held next month on June 19.


