WHEREAS, the City of Bardstown performed a rate study to revise its rates to appropriately cover

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

Amendments be made to CHAPTER 55: COMBINED UTILITIES SYSTEM, subsection 55.05 Billing;

When Due; Penalty.

§ 55.05 BILLING; WHEN DUE; PENALTY; DEPOSITS; ACCOUNT FEES

This section shall be amended to reflect that the CAO instead of the CFO shall be responsible for certain responsibilities related to billing and application of payments to accounts, and adding subsections (E) and (F), which read as follows:

(E) Each single residential unit or multiple-residential unit shall tender to the

application for any utility connection, a deposit as set forth in the rate table below. These rates apply to residential customers only. Deposits for commercial establishments will be determined at the time of application for utilities which shall be in the sum equivalent to six weeks' billing for all connected utility services. The deposit shall be retained by the city and if necessary, upon termination of service, applied towards payment of any delinquent balances or refunded to the user (residential or commercial) after two years, provided all balances have been kept current during the two years and no checks were returned for any reason during that period.

(F) Other account fees th (1) A return check charge of \$50.00 shall be applied to all returned check payments (2) An after-hours service fee of \$75.00 for any and all service calls made after hours may be

(3) A disconnect fee of \$25.00 will apply to all customer accounts within the Bardstown City limits. A disconnect fee of \$40.00 will apply to all customer accounts outside of Bardstown City limits.

(4) A truck roll fee of \$30 will apply to customer requested services during normal business.

A truck roll red of \$3 will apply to testomer requested service, and turn-on/turn-off meter service.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict. This ordinances shall be in full force and effect following publication as required by law.
