
# **Festivities set for Stephen Foster Story celebration**

With different types of jewelry and other craft items already under her belt, the decision to start her own business stemmed from her purchase of a laser. The machine expanded her creation abilities, allowing her to not only customize colors and sizes but also add more items to her portfolio. As Johnson's business grew, so too did her laser needs, compelling her to purchase two additional machines. These both increase her output ability and allow her to add more jewelry engravings.

Between her craft experience and the lasers, Johnson has exponentially increased her portfolio. With items ranging from earrings to bookmarks to magnets to ornaments to keychains and everything in between — all of which can be customized or personalized, as requested — the business has something for everyone.

"Basically, if it's wood or metal and it's safe to engrave or cut, I can do it."

Johnson is currently awaiting the arrival of a UV printer. The machine, which she said can print "on just about any solid surface," will give her the opportunity to create her own supplies. She hopes to have the equipment by the end of summer, and especially before holiday season.

"If I'm cutting earrings out of a sheet of acrylic, I could design my own and print it instead of buying it from a supplier," she said. "It also allows me to offer a wider range, because if [an item] is not laser safe to engrave, I'm [currently] limited ... Also with engraving, you're limited to whatever color the material engraves. But, if I print on the UV printer, it will be able to be multicolor — the options are kind of endless at that point."

Another goal of Johnson's is to always keep customers engaged and coming back with new items.

"I don't want to just keep remaking the same pair of earrings, because then everybody that shops from me have already seen everything I have," she said. "So, I'm always looking for something new and something cool that I

can offer. I try to partner with small businesses, I do a lot with Claudette [Rateau, Adult Services Librarian] at [The LaRue County Public Library], I have some things in the Lincoln Museum, so I'm always looking for opportunities to do more."

As a craft business. Johnson has found most of her success through vendor and craft events; however, being in a small town has also helped.

"I've had more success here by word of mouth and just being in a small town," she said. "I sell to people now that I've never met before, which is so cool to me, or I'll just get a random Facebook message that says, 'Hey, I heard about you. Can you do this?' and I love that."

As Artist of the Month, an exhibit featuring artwork by Maisie Mae Creations will be on display throughout the month of June at the LaRue County Public Library, located at 215 Lincoln Dr., Hodgenville.
