On May 17, the Elizabeth Campbell Russell Chapter Inc, Daughters of the American Revolution, unveiled a Veterans memorial stone for Mike Severs.

Mike was a native of Muhlenberg County and served with the Ky Militia during the War of 1812, Battle of New Orleans. His sharpshooter abilities made him an asset on the battlefield as he was asked to "take out" the highest ranking British Commander. This deed was completed and he headed back to Muhlenberg County where he continued to supply the residents with game he had killed and maple sugar he had cured. On the sunny, breezy afternoon, in May 2025, the VA Memorial headstone for Mike Severs was unveiled.
