

Louisville City takes down hosts Lexington SC

LEXINGTON— Jake Morris scored twice in stoppage time to lift Louisville City FC to a dramatic 2-1 win over Lexington SC on July 26, securing the Commonwealth Cup in front of a sold out Lexington SC Stadium.

Lexington’s Jacob Greene opened the scoring in the 87th minute, but Morris responded with goals in the 91st and 97th minutes to seal the victory for LouCity. Louisville outshot the hosts 33-9 and held nearly 38% of possession in Lexington’s defensive third.

With the win, LouCity claimed the season series after also winning the first meeting in May, 2-0. The victory didn’t affect LouCity’s Jägermeister Cup standing but ensured bragging rights over their in-state rival.

LouCity returns home July 29 to face German club Eintracht Frankfurt in an international friendly.

Scheffler wins British Open

PORTRUSH, Northern Ireland—Scotie Scheffler fired a final-round 68 to win the British Open by four shots July 20 at Royal Portrush, capturing his second major of the year and fourth overall.

Harris English was runner-up again, while Rory McIlroy tied for seventh on home soil. Bryson DeChambeau’s 64 was the round of the day. Scheffler now sits one major away from a career Grand Slam.

The Open returns to Royal Birkdale next year.

To give you a voice to the people in your life that God wastes nothing, and uses everything, to make us into the perfect vessel to hold his timeless message.
