at least 18 years old, have a qualifying medical condition, and obtain a state-issued registry ID card through a certified medical cannabis practitioner. Qualifying conditions include cancer, chronic pain, epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, post-traumatic stress disorder, and other serious illnesses. Patients may purchase up to a 30-day supply per product category.

The Post Dispensary is expected to employ up to 20 people from the surrounding area. Additional licensees, including processors and testing laboratories, are expected to begin operations in the coming weeks, with more dispensaries and cultivation facilities planned across the state.
