

Wohner pleads not guilty, has August jury trial set

Brian Wohnner appeared in Marion Circuit Court Division 2 on April 17, where he entered a not-guilty plea and had his jury trial date set.

Wohner, 47, is charged with two counts of first-degree rape, victim under 12 years of age, two counts of first-degree sodomy, victim under 12 years of age, and incest with a person less than 12 years of age. He was indicted on April 3 by the Marion County Grand Jury on 11 counts against one minor, and 13 counts against the other.

He had a pretrial conference set for June 12 at 1:00 p.m., and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 12 at 8:30 a.m. He also had an other hearing set for May 7 at 9:00 a.m.

• Thomas Goodin, who is charged with first-degree rape, victim under 12 years of age, four counts of first-degree sodomy, victim under 12 years of age, first-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense (methamphetamine), operating a motor vehicle under the influence of a controlled substance, first offense (aggravated circumstance), failure to produce an insurance card, first-degree possession of a controlled substance, second offense (cocaine), possession of marijuana, drug paraphernalia-buy/possess, and possession of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor under 12 years of age, has a review set for July 29 at 8:30 a.m.

• Sylvia Reid is scheduled to be arraigned on May 9 at 1:00 p.m. Reid is charged with third-degree burglary, theft by unlawful taking or disposition all others, and first-degree persistent felony offender.

• Joseph D. Bartley, the court will enter an amended judgment to 22-CR-0248 to include Marion 23-CR-0010-001 and is to run concurrent to Nelson 22-CR-227 and Bullitt 23-CR-0046.

• James Wesley Brady has a review set for June 12 at 1:00 p.m. for closure.

• Thomas A. Brady is scheduled to be sentenced on July 10 at 1:00 p.m. on the charge of first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater or equal to

4 grams of cocaine).

• Timothy Allen Bright has a pretrial conference set for June 12 at 1:00 p.m. and the parties have requested mediation. He is charged with first-degree enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater or equal to 4 grams of cocaine), first-degree enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance (less than 10 dosage units of opiates), and third-degree enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (less than 20 dosage units drug unspecified).

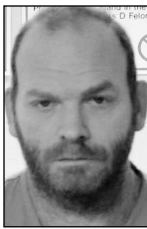
• Timothy Buckler has a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance, second or greater offense (greater or equal to 4 grams of cocaine), enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (heroin), and first-degree enhancement trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater or equal to 10 dosage units drug unspecified).

• Hunter Caldwell Livers has a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with third-degree burglary, first-degree criminal mischief, theft by unlawful taking or disposition all others \$1,000 but under \$10,000, and second-degree persistent felony offender.

• Autumn Campbell has a probation revocation hearing set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m. The court agreed to long-term treatment or IOP as a condition/sanction if Nelson Co. does not revoke.

• Bruce Clark has a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m. Clark is charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense (methamphetamine), tampering with physical evidence, possession of marijuana, and license to be in possession.

pretrial conference set for June 12 at 1:00 p.m. and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 12 at 8:30 a.m. He is charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition all others \$1,000 but under \$10,000, receiving stolen property \$1,000 but under \$10,000, tampering with physical evidence, first-degree criminal mischief, and first-degree persistent felony offender.

• Rodney Furman was remanded per Kentucky.

• Pedro Garcia has a pretrial conference set for June 12 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater or equal to 4 grams of cocaine), first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater or equal to 2 grams of methamphetamine), and drug paraphernalia-buy/possess.

• Dalton Greenwell has a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance, third or greater offense (methamphetamine), public intoxication of controlled substances (excludes alcohol), and resisting arrest.

• Sherry L Hack pleaded guilty and was sentenced by Judge Kaelin Reed to 2 years probated for 2 years on the charge of first-degree possession of a controlled substance-fentanyl, 12 months probated for 24 months for second-degree possession of a controlled substance-drug unspecified, and public intoxication controlled substances-excludes alcohol (90 days probated for 6 months).

• Brittany Star Hall has a probation revocation hearing set for May 9 at 1:00 p.m.

• Harvey Morgan has completed diversion and instead of revocation the court imposed a sanction of time served and the case was closed.

• Heather M. Hill pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: Third-degree possession

of a controlled substance-methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia-buy/possess (12 months probated for 24 months), failure of non-owner operator to maintain required insurance, first offense, license to be in possession and failure to produce an insurance card (90 days probated for 6 months).

• Raymond Leeman has a pretrial conference set for May 22 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree wanton endangerment, second-degree fleeing or evading police (motor vehicle), operating on a suspended/revoked operator's license, failure to notify address change to the Department of Transportation, and speeding 15 mph over the limit.

Caal-Garcia gave police his name as Erick Alonzo Garcia. He was later indicted by a Marion Grand Jury. He remains lodged in the Marion County Detention Center on a \$2,000,000 bond.

• Jacqueline Armel had a pretrial conference set for May 22 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for June 30 at 8:30 a.m. Armel is charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense (cocaine), and drug paraphernalia-buy/possess.

• Malaki S. Bond stipulated probable cause and the order was signed dismissing the case without prejudice. Bond was charged with theft by unlawful taking \$500 or more but under \$10,000.

• Trena Dachele Carter was sentenced to 1 year probated for 3 years on the charge of first-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense (methamphetamine). She also had a probation revocation hearing, where it was noted that the restitution was paid in full, but the motion to revoke her probation was denied and the case was closed.

• Billy Ray Caudill pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: First-degree possession of a controlled substance-fentanyl (2 years pretrial diverted for 3 years), operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/substances, second offense (1-year license suspension, 30 days probated for 24 months), and failure

to surrender a revoked operator's license (90 days probated for 6 months).

• Daniel Dorton's status conference passed to July 10 at 9:00 a.m. He is charged with second-degree burglary and first-degree criminal mischief.

Fisher has a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for May 21 at 8:30 a.m.

• Robert L. Fogle had a motion to revoke his probation set for a hearing on May 9 at 9:00 a.m. with no bond pending the hearing.

• Elaine Hancock appeared in court under the influence of meth and opiates not prescribed, a violation of her bond conditions. The court remanded her into custody without bond. She entered a plea of not guilty to the charges of first-degree wanton endangerment, and fourth-degree assault and had a pretrial conference set for May 9 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 25 at 8:30 a.m.

• Alexa Gutierrez violated her probation and the court imposed a sanction of credit for time served for leaving treatment and failure to report. She was released from

custody and must report to Probation and Parole two times a month for the next six months and the motion to revoke her probation was denied.

• Cameron Hunt had a pretrial conference set for May 22 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for June 30 at 8:30 a.m. Hunt is charged with failure to comply with sex offender registration (first offense), and first-degree persistent felony offender.

• Matthew Livers had a Drug Court referral signed and his jury trial, set for April 21, was remanded and a status conference was set for May 9 at 9:00 a.m. Livers is charged with first-degree enhancement possession of a controlled substance, first offense (cocaine), second-degree enhancement possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), enhancement possession of marijuana, controlled substance prescription not in its original container, first offense, failure of owner to maintain the required insurance/security, first offense, and rear license not illuminated.

• Hannah Kaitlyn Maggard is compliant with the terms of supervision and the motion to revoke her probation was denied.

• Daniel M. Mings pleaded not guilty to the charges of operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, fourth or greater offense (aggravated circumstance), driving a motor vehicle while license was suspended for a DUI-third or greater offense, reckless driving, possession of an open alcohol beverage container in a motor vehicle,

and first-degree persistent felony offender. He had a pretrial conference set for June 26 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 25 at 8:30 a.m. His bond will remain the same.

• James Daniel Nalley pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the charge of first-degree possession of a controlled substance first offense-methamphetamine (2 years pretrial diverted for 3 years).

• April Nalley pleaded not guilty to fraudulent insurance acts-\$10,000 or more but less than \$1 million, and theft of identity of another without consent. Her pretrial conference was set for June 26 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial was scheduled for Aug. 25 at 8:30 a.m. Her bond was modified to \$5,000 unsecured with no violations of the law and no use of drugs or alcohol.

• Ashanta M. Scott stipulated violating her probation for possession of marijuana and absconding and failing to complete treatment. A Drug Court referral was signed and the motion to revoke probation was passed to May 9 at 9:00 a.m., and no bond pending the hearing.

• Kennedy Petit pleaded not guilty to the charges of third-degree assault-inmate assault on a corrections employee, second-degree escape identify facility, and second-degree criminal mischief. A pretrial conference was set for May 21 at 9:00 a.m. in Washington County, and a jury trial was scheduled for June 30 at 8:30 a.m.

• Valerie Smothers pleaded guilty and was

sentenced on the following charges: Tampering with physical evidence (5 years probated for 5 years), violation of conditions of release (12 months probated for 24 months), third-degree criminal mischief (90 days probated for 6 months). Her bond was modified to \$5,000 unsecured on the conditions of no violations of the law and no use of drugs or alcohol. The final sentencing was set for June 12 at 9:00 a.m.

• Dustin M. Thompson has a pretrial conference set for July 10 at 9:00 a.m. and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 25 at 9:30 a.m. He is charged with first-degree wanton endangerment-police officer, first-degree fleeing or evading police (motor vehicle), first-degree fleeing or evading police (on foot), reckless driving, speeding 26 mph or greater over the limit, improperly on the left side of the road, disregarding a stop sign, failure to wear seat belts, failure to or improper signal, rear license not illuminated, improper start from a parked position, resisting arrest, menacing, possession of an open alcohol beverage container in a motor vehicle, attempted murder-police officer, second-degree assault-police officer, first-degree strangulation, disarming a police officer, and theft by unlawful taking or disposition-firearm.

• Justin Thompson had his arraignment passed to May 9 at 9:00 a.m., and his bond was modified to \$2,000 full cash on the condition of no violations of the law, no use of drugs or alcohol, and no contact with the victim. Thompson is

charged with a convicted felon in possession of a firearm, third-degree assault-police/probation officer-identified, fourth-degree assault domestic violence minor injury, three counts of third-degree terroristic threatening, and resisting arrest.

• Francis Wethington had his motion to consolidate his two indictments sustained without prejudice. His jury trial was set for April 21 at 8:30 a.m. He is charged with promoting human trafficking (victim under 18 years of age), two counts of first-degree persistent felony offender, first-degree unlawful transaction with a minor illegal controlled substance under 16 years of age, first-degree possession of a controlled substance, third or greater offense (methamphetamine), and two counts of second-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified).

• Dallas W. Abell had financial obligations set for a review on July 24 at 9:00 a.m.

• Darrick Lamont Frazier failed to appear and had a bench warrant issued.

• Patrick D. Whitlock pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: First-degree possession of a controlled substance, third or greater offense-methamphetamine (3 years probated for 5 years), and possession of marijuana (90 days probated for 6 months). He must be assessed by SSC and his bond was modified to \$5,000 unsecured. The final sentencing was set for June 12 at 9:00 a.m.
