Tentative budget presented at school board meeting

A pay raise and an increase in bus driver trip pay were among the items discussed at the May 5 special called meeting of the Marion County School Board.

Director of Operation Scott Spalding addressed the board in regard to the upcoming

budget. "The district first created a draft of a restructured salary schedule that included pay increases, although not a set amount or percentage across the board," Spalding said. "The goal was to improve the salary schedule in general after looking at the salary schedules from surrounding districts." He said the Board of Education then recommended an additional 3% raise on top of that restructured salary schedule, which was ultimately passed at the meeting.

"The board wanted us to remain competitive, not only competitive but better with the districts around us," Superintendent Chris Brady said. "I felt like it was best to develop what we would have considered the perfect salary schedule for Marion County.'

When you factor in the pay increase employees see each year because of the additional year of service they've put in (we refer to this as the Step increase), every MCPS employee will receive, at a minimum, around a 3.5% raise," he said. "Some employees, based on where they are on the salary schedule, could see a double-digit percentage increase. Ultimately, this was a way to first improve our salary schedule and then the Board of Education went beyond that with an additional 3% in pay." He also noted that there would be an increase in bus driver


