Under the plea agreement, the charge of receiving stolen property was dismissed and the charge of attempted murder of a police officer was amended to criminal attempt to commit assault. Hale pleaded guilty to the amended charge of criminal attempt to commit assault, seven counts of first-degree wanton endangerment, operating on a suspended/revoked operators license, and persistent felony offender. The agreement called for a total sentence of 20 years. Plant Board approves new electric provider. The Electric Plant Board of the City of Vanceburg voted to move forward with AEP as the provider for three years after May 31, 2025, when the local utility's contract with Kentucky Power is finished.
