671,000 voters removed from rolls

Secretary of Michael Adams nounced Friday that the number of registered voters in Kentucky has declined significantly since he took office in 2020, despite Kentucky's rising population during that time.

This finding comes following the removal of 231,110 ineligible voters from the rolls in February in compliance with federal and state law.

"On my watch, we have removed 671,292 ineligible voters from Kentucky's rolls, including 255,484 deceased voters," said Adams. "Kentuckians istration accounts for 47 trust our elections, and they should."
