"There was good cause shown in that particular instance. It was included in the resolution for that explicit purpose of adoption," Harrison added. "If you're going to do this we need some good cause to put in the resolution."

Harrison asked how many residents would be served.

Underwood responded that there is currently one residence on Cedar Lane and three on Waring Cemetery Road.

Harrison presented differences in public roads and county maintained roads.

"If you want a resolution we can talk about what to put in there and the court votes on it, obviously," Harrison said.

Underwood said he had already discussed obtaining rights-of-way from property owners on those roadways.

US Constitution Amendment IV

The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported publicizing their checkpoints for some time now and they by oath or affirmation, and still make arrests of people particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.
