In March 1985, all roads led to Lexington for the NCAA Final Four. In 1986, Rupp Arena played host to both the Southeastern Conference Tourney and the NCAA Women's Final Four.

The arena has been site to numerous NCAA Regional Tournaments, including 1989, 1992, and 1996 NCAA Southeast Regionals. Rupp has played host to past NCAA first and second rounds, including a first round regional just this past week.


