The Lewis County Alert System continued to gain followers. It was activated 13 times in February to notify residents of snow emergencies, power interruptions, weather advisories, flooding, and closings. The alert system allows notifications to our residents through text, email, voice (telephone), Twitter, and the Smart 911 App. Targeted alerts can notify small groups (specific county offices/groups/employees).
