 $\sqrt{Banana}$  peels chopped in fine pieces can be used as a natural fertilizer in the flower garden. Bury the chopped peels in the soil around plants and when decomposed, the plants will become greener and healthier.

√Repurpose eggshells. Crushed eggshells buried in soil around tomato and pepper plants can be used as a natural fertilizer to boost the health of the soil and the plant.
