
Morgan Schools Local **Planning Committee** meeting slated June 5

School dist. addresses rumors of potential middle school closure

District's Local Planning Committee submits facilities plan for possible consolidation to KDE; local citizens sign petition and express concerns

School district officials recently addressed the rumored potential closure of Morgan County Middle School following the circulation of an online petition to keep the facility

The petition – created on May 22 by an individual listed as Lytisha Lester – outlines supporters' rationale for keeping the school open:

"To close Morgan County Middle School and transition 7th and 8th grade students to Morgan County High School is a matter of grave concern for the residents of West Liberty, KY. We stand united in preserving the distinct educational environment that the middle school provides, which is crucial for the transitional phase of young adolescents.

"Middle school is a pivotal stage in a child's educational

journey, offering a unique learning atmosphere tailored specifically to the developmental needs of pre-teens. Closing this institution would only disrupt the academic continuity for these students.

"According to data from the National Center for Education Statistics, schools with overcrowded classrooms often face significant challenges in maintaining educational standards. Morgan County High School, which is at risk of becoming overcrowded, could suffer similar consequences, affecting the overall learning environment and student performance.

"The changes could also impact students' participation in after-school activities, which are crucial for holistic development.

"By keeping Morgan County Middle School open, we preserve an essential com-

Fiscal Court holds first readings of tourism and budget ordinances

The Morgan County Fiscal Court during a regular May 22 meeting held the first readings of a tourism ordinance and a proposed budget for 2025-2026 fiscal year.

Tourism Ordinance – First Reading

Judge Executive Jim Gazay presented an ordinance regarding the formation of a county tourism commission and the implementation of a 3 percent transient room tax for visitors staying at local campgrounds, cabins and other recreational lodging areas.

"This is an ordinance implementing the establishment of a tourism commission and imposing a transient room tax in Morgan County," said. "The tax will only affect visitors who are coming in and staying at campgrounds, etc. [out in the county]. We've already got one campground up already, and another person with a 150-acre campground in the northern part of the county, I think. So we've got to get in front of this. We've got other stuff in Powell County headed this way. So that's what this is
