The PER shall comply with the guidance established by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Utilities Service (RUS) Bulletin 1780-2. The Manchester Float Park Project includes the multi-objective redevelopment of the drinking water impoundment dam on Goose Creek for drinking water intake function, flood stability, in-stream recreation, fish passage, and public safety. Up to three engineered drops shall be considered for safe downstream passage, whitewater recreation, and/or river surfing. Statement of Qualifications Content
The Statement of Qualifications should include

the following information:


1. A brief history of the firm and relevant background information.
 2. The capability to achieve the proposed work, reflecting knowledge of regulations, engineering, and constructability of in-stream projects.
 3. Experience in developing Preliminary Engineering Reports or feasibility studies for similar projects.
 4. Samples of at least three (3) similar projects for which the firm was responsible, including references and their contact information.
 5. Information about key personnel with a description of their responsibilities and duties in regard to similar projects.
- Submissions
Statements of Qualifications shall be submitted electronically to Mayor Steve Collins no later than 4:00PM local time on 07/01/25. No submissions will be accepted after this time.

public utility pole or set up any chairs or any table on the public right of way. The vendor shall not in any manner damage public property or the public right of way. Examples include but are not necessarily limited to the use of stakes, rods, or any method that is required to be drilled, driven, or otherwise fixed in an asphalt pavement, curb, bricks, sidewalks, or buildings. Jury trial set for Clay man accused of murder

A jury trial has been set for a Manchester man that allegedly shot his mother multiple times in May 2021.

Jonathan Hubbard, 41, faces charges of attempted murder and three counts of theft by unlawful taking valued over \$500 but less than \$10,000 in connection to the incident. He was indicted on those charges in July 2021.

Hubbard appeared in Whitley Circuit Court Tuesday, June 10, where prosecutors asked for a jury trial date to be scheduled in the case. Judge Dan Ballou, who presided over the case, set a trial date for January 6, 2026. The trial is expect to take two to three days.

On May 18, 2021, Hubbard allegedly stabbed his mother and fired a gun towards her in an attempt to kill her before taking a Dodge Dakota, a .380 caliber handgun, and a .38 caliber handgun, according to his indictment.

According to police, the victim was found in the front yard of her residence suffering from multiple

wounds, but was conscious and talking. She allegedly told police that it was her son, Jonathan Hubbard, who had injured her.

A BOLO (Be on the look out) alert was sent out to area law enforcement, which led Kentucky State Police locating Hubbard's vehicle at McDonald's in Manchester. Police were able to safely approach Hubbard and take him into custody without incident. He remains lodged in the Whitley County Detention Center.
