Wingo Water Line Public Hearing Notice

To all interested citizens of Wingo, Kentucky:

The Kentucky Department for Local Government is accepting application material under the 2025 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The City of Wingo intends to apply for assistance to renovate, upgrade, and improve the City's Water Lines. The improved facility will offer services that meet the needs of the surrounding community and Wingo with safer and more robust functional equipment. The City of Wingo will hold a public hearing prior to the submission of the pre-submission form. The public hearing will be held on Monday, August 11, 2025, at 2:00pm at Wingo City Hall. The purpose of this hearing is to obtain views on housing and community development needs, review proposed activities, review the proposed application, and solicit public comments. Technical assistance is available to help groups representing low and moderate income persons in developing proposals.

The following information concerning the CDBG program is available for public inspection at the City of Wingo City Hall, 9606 US-45 during regular business hours:

Amount of funds available and range of activities that may be undertaken. Estimated amounts of funds proposed to be used for activities benefiting persons of low and moderate income.

Plans for minimizing displacement of persons as a result of activities associated with CDBG funds and plans for providing assistance to those persons to be actually displaced as a result of CDBG-funded activities. Records regarding the past use of CDBG funds.

A copy of the CDBG application material will be on file at the City of Wingo City Hall 9606 US-45 for citizens' review and comment during regular business hours from June 30, 2025, through August 8, 2025. Comments on the proposed application may be submitted to the attention of Mayor Charles Shelby until the close of business on August 8, 2025.

Poet Walker to visit western Kentucky

TRIGG COUNTY, Ky. – Kentucky Poet Laureate Frank X. Walker will visit western Kentucky for two public events in August and September, offering readings and discussions of his literary and visual art.

Walker will speak at the Janice Mason Art Museum in Cadiz on Saturday, Aug. 16, at 5:30 p.m., as part of the museum's ARTalks Series, according to a news release from Dr. Carrie Jerrell of Murray State University. The event, titled "From Word to Image explore Walker's dual

Walker will return to the region on Thursday, Sept. 4, for a reading and discussion at Center Ballroom on the campus of Murray State University. Both events are free and open to the public.

A native of Danville, Walker is the first African American writer to be named Kentucky Poet Laureate. He has authored 15 collections of poetry, including "Turn Me Loose: The Unghosting of Medgar Evers," which won the 2014 NAACP Image and Back Again," will literary arts. His visit is Award for Poetry and supported by Genesis a Black Caucus Ameri-

Honor Award. His latest book, "Load in Nine Times," gives voice to Black Civil War soldiers.

In addition to his writ-7:30 p.m. in the Curris ing, Walker has worked in visual art and comics. His exhibit, "We Wear the Mask: Black Superheroes through the Ages," showcases his collection of Black superhero memorabilia and has been displayed at venues including the Lyric Theatre in Lexington and Purdue University. His recent multimedia art collection, "Black Star Seed: When Mi Cyaan Find Di Words," was exhibited at the Carnegie Center for Literacy and Learning.





The Puzzmo team has been hard at work making some site improvements that you'll start to see rolling out soon.
