Child Find for Children with Disabilities in Need of Special Education or 504 Services

Child Find
The Martin County School District keeps educational records in a secure location in each school and Board office.

The Martin County School District obtains written consent from a parent or eligible student (age 18 or who is attending a postsecondary institution), before disclosing personally identifiable information to an entity or individual not authorized to receive it under FERPA.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. The Martin County School District may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request seven years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The Martin County School District may retain, for an indefinite period, a record of the student’s name, address, telephone number, grades, attendance records, classes attended, grade level completed, and year completed.

Children eligible for Special Education include those children

with disabilities who have autism, deaf-blindness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment need Special Education services.

Children eligible for 504 services include those children in a public elementary and secondary education program who have a current physical or mental impairment that currently substantially limits some major life activity that causes the student’s ability to access the school environment or school activities to be substantially limited.

Children eligible for the State-Funded Preschool program include three- and four-year-old children identified with disabilities and four-year-old children who are at-risk, as defined by federal poverty levels up to 150%. Preschool children eligible for special education must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP) instead of a 504 plan to receive State-Funded Preschool program services.

The Martin County School District has an ongoing “Child Find” system, which is designed to locate, identify and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence within its geographical boundaries, age three (3) to twenty-one (21) years, who may have a disability and be

In accordance with KRS 350.070, notice is hereby given that Wayland Land Company, Inc., P.O. Box 2725, Pikeville, Kentucky 41502, has applied for an Amendment to an existing surface coal mining and reclamation operation located 2.44 miles southeast of Debord in Martin County. The amendment will add 229.33 acres of surface disturbance making a total area of 460.50 acres within the revised permit boundary.

The proposed amendment is approximately 0.30 miles north from KY Route 908’s junction with Mullett Branch County Road and located along Messer Branch of Coldwater Creek. The proposed operation is located on the Inez U.S.G.S. 7 1/2 minute quadrangle map. The surface area to be disturbed by the amendment is owned by MBM Production, LLC, Curtis Young, Larry Ray Young, Connie and Joe Staton, Mitchell and Brenda Moore, James Ward, Wayland Land Company, Inc., Helen Ruth Preece Adkins, James David Sheppard, Timothy R. 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Request for Proposal (RFP)

Project Title: Blacktop Resurfacing and Water Drainage Improvements

1. Project Overview:

For this project the blacktop needs resurfaced in the front and back parking lots of the Martin County Health Department. Additionally, in the back parking lot there are drainage issues that need addressed. There are areas that constantly have puddling leading to damaged pavement.

The Martin County Health Department is seeking proposals from qualified contractors for the resurfacing of blacktop and the resolution of water drainage problems in the back parking lot and water entering the back bay garage door. Appropriate drainage mitigation is needed in front of the door. The work includes resurfacing with new blacktop addressing areas where water drainage is inadequate, leading to puddling and damage to the pavement.

2. Scope of Work:

The selected contractor will be responsible for the following tasks:

- **Blacktop Resurfacing:**
 - Assess the current condition of the blacktop, including cracks, potholes, and general wear.
 - Prepare the surface for resurfacing, which may include cleaning, grading, and patching any areas of significant damage.
 - Resurface the entire area with a high-quality, durable asphalt mix.
 - Ensure proper compaction and finishing for smooth, long-lasting pavement.
- **Water Drainage Solutions:**
 - Identify areas where water is improperly draining or pooling on the surface.
 - Install or repair drainage systems, such as trench drains, catch basins, or stormwater management solutions.
 - Regrade areas where necessary to direct water flow away from the blacktop and toward designated drainage systems.

 - Proposers may assume the use of the adjacent storm drain catch basin near the front of the garage on the gas company property as they develop the drainage mitigation proposal.

NOTICE OF BLASTING
SCHEDULE APPLICATION
NUMBER 880-0287

In accordance with the provisions of 405 KAR 16:120, Section 3, notice is hereby given that Wayland Land Company, Inc., P.O. Box 2725, Pikeville, Kentucky 41502, (606) 437-1447, proposes the following blasting schedule. The blasting site consists of approximately 246.32 acres located approximately 2.44 miles southeast of Debord in Martin County, Kentucky.

The area is located approximately 0.30 miles north from KY State Route 908’s junction with Mullett Branch County Road and located along to Messer Branch at Latitude 37° 48’ 20” and Longitude 82° 30’ 59”. Detonations of explosives are proposed to occur daily, sunrise to sunset, from April 23, 2025 to April 23, 2026.

Control of the blasting area will be maintained by blocking the access roads to the area at least ten (10) minutes prior to the blast. Traffic on all public and private roads to a minimum of 1000 feet of the blast site will be controlled at least ten (10) minutes prior to the blast to prevent any vehicles from entering the blasting area. Entry to the blasting area will be regulated by signs and barriers. An authorized company representative (flagman) will check the area for unauthorized persons or property and prohibit access to the blasting area by unauthorized persons at least ten minutes prior to each detonation. The pre-detonation warning signal shall consist of a one (1) minute series of long siren blasts five (5) minutes prior to the blast signal. The blast signal shall consist of a series of short siren blasts one (1) minute prior to the shot. The all clear signal shall consist of a prolonged siren blast following the inspection of the blast site. All roads leading to or near the blast site will remain closed until the all clear signal is given. The warning and all clear signal will be audible within one-half (1/2) mile from the blast point. Signs will be posted and maintained which outline the blasting schedule and the meaning of the blast warning signals.
