

Pikeville Community Kitchen Director Kathy Hamilton said, "We have the Dream Center here giving away clothes, and we're giving away drawstring backpacks full of school supplies. We have pizzas and we have cupcakes. We are also giving out snow cones."

Defendant indicates possible change of plea in federal child porn case

A Pikeville man accused of the possession and production of child pornography filed a motion asking the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky to extend certain procedural dates regarding his case.

According to court records, Lonnie James Maynard, 54, of Burning Fork, is scheduled to stand trial on Aug. 18 on federal charges of production of child pornography and possession of child pornography in Ashland.

The motion, filed July 31, by his
