Reds' De La Cruz belts 2 long homers in win

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Elly De La Cruz hit two long home runs, Brady Singer pitched seven strong innings against his former team and the Cincinnati Reds beat the Kansas City Royals 7-2 on Tuesday night.

De La Cruz hit a 436-foot shot to center in the fourth inning that tied the score at

2 against Jonathan Bowlan, then a go-ahead 451-foot drive into the right-center fountain in the sixth off Taylor Clarke (1-1). De La Cruz has 11 home runs this season. He tied Pete Rose's team record for switch-hitters with five multihomer games, including two this year.

Singer (6-3), acquired from the Royals in November,

allowed two runs and seven singles.

Tyler Stephenson homered in the second, but Kyle Isbel and Jonathan India had RBI single in the bottom half.

Switzerland coach Wrightsman leaving for Jennings County

Wrightsman to lead Panthers this season

VEVAY, IN — Switzerland County boys basketball head coach Travis Wrightsman is leaving that position for the head coaching job at Jennings County High School.

Wrightsman, the head coach at Switzerland County in Vevay after previously coaching at South Ripley in Versailles, was officially hired by the Jennings County School Corporation at its board meeting last Thursday evening. He has more than 300 career wins.

A native of New Castle, Indiana, Wrightsman is a graduate of Blackburn College in Illinois where he was a standout player on the men's basketball team. He was inducted into the Blackburn's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

He has been in education

for 27 years and coached basketball for 22 years, both in Missouri and Indiana.

The coach emphasizes the importance of hard work, discipline, and teamwork, shaping not just skilled players but also well-rounded individuals.

"I applied at Jennings County because of the tradition they have with the basketball program, great community support, and the nice community," Wrightsman commented. "Our goals for the first season will be to get better each day, develop a positive culture, and continue to build our basketball program into something the community can be proud of."

Wrightsman will be teaching weight training and credit recovery classes while at the high school. He and his wife, Gayle, are the parents of four children: Taylor who lives in Missouri; Bryce just graduated from college; Molly will be a sophomore at Indiana University, and Carter is in second grade. They will be moving to the community.

Greenwoods complete Fight for Air Climb in Indy


Gary and Janet Greenwood of Milton, Kentucky, recently competed in the American Lung Association's Fight for Air Climb at the Salesforce Tower in Indianapolis.

They were among 362 participants raising money to help 1,164,000 Hoosiers living with lung disease, the leading cause of cancer death

among both men and women in the United States.

They both climbed the 47 floors of the Salesforce Tower — the tallest building in Indiana — with Gary completing the 47 floors in 12 minutes, 12.7 seconds to place first in the 70 and over age group. Janet made the climb in 18 minutes, 16.1 seconds, improving on her time from last year by almost a minute.
