

Ohio Valley Folkways Symposium this summer at Eleutherian College

Historic Eleutherian College will host a four-session series, Ohio Valley Folkways Symposium, beginning in June and continuing once monthly through September — all on Sunday afternoons from 1-4 p.m.

Session 1 “Poetry of the Old Northwest” kicks off the series Sunday, June 8, featuring a performance of Kentucky inspired poems by acclaimed U.S. National Beat Poet Laureate Ron Whitehead, accompanied by singer Cait Justice and guitarist Tommy Bays. Historian Glory-June Greiff will give a brief presentation on Early Indiana Poet Sarah T. Bolton. Native American flute music by Fred Nez Keams will also be

featured throughout the event. Regional artists and poets will present live readings of historical and contemporary prose and poetry, and a one-day art exhibit will highlight the cultural heritage of the Ohio Valley.

Session 2 is “Quest for Freedom” on July 13 featuring Indiana Poet Laureate Curtis Crisler. Session 3 is “Rivers to Railroads” on Aug. 3 featuring Poet Susan Mason Scott and the “West of Dublin” band. Session 4 on Sept. 14 is “Down on the Farm,” with readings of James Whitcomb Riley poetry. All sessions will include tours of the building and a special art and artifact exhibit.

The series was the idea of local artist Patty Cooper Wells to share stories at the college, an historic landmark.

“We are so happy to collaborate with Patty on this project, and we welcome the

opportunity for more folks to visit the Eleutherian College,” said Jan Vetrhus, president of the Board of Directors. The new series is funded by a grant from the Jefferson County Board of Tourism.

“We will be celebrating the culture and history of both Indiana and Kentucky, their similarities and differences. Here in southern Indiana, both cultures tend to overlap a bit as we are so close in geography. There are and have

been wonderful artists on both sides of the river,” said Wells. “The college is a stately stone structure — a jewel of local history and architecture. The name derives from the Greek word ‘Eleutherius’ meaning ‘freedom or equality,’” she said.

The Eleutherian College will have its annual Fall Gathering Saturday Oct. 18 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
