worked out of trouble until they couldn't in the top of the ninth. "Right there at the end, we probably shocked the heck out of everybody," Beavers coach Mitch Canham said. "They bring guys in, we're finding ways to get on base — hit by pitch, base hit, what have you." Aiva Arquette homered to left-center on Wyatt Danilowicz's first pitch, and Gavin Turley, Weber and AJ Singer reached to load the bases with no outs.

Oregon State tied it 6-all when Tyce Peterson's slow roller glanced off Alicea's glove at shortstop and into the outfield grass, allowing two runs to score. Tucker Biven (5-0) struck out Jacob Krieg, and Carson McEntire got Reeder to pop out.

"You knew they were going

to make a rally there late," McDonnell said. "And we pitched so well, but one of their best hitters jumps on a heater, and their other best hitter (Turley) fights off a ball and it drops. It's like, OK, you're in it here now; you're going to have to grind this out and earn it. And they made us earn it."

The Beavers played as an independent this year and will again next season before the Pac-12 ramps back up in 2026-27. They had only 19 regular-season home games, logged nearly 25,000 air miles and won enough to be the No. 8 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. They won five elimination games in regionals and super regionals.

"What a season we had. What a run," Arquette said.

ORDINANCE 2025-08
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 35.187 OF CHAPTER 35 OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON CODE OF ORDINANCES
WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton has found and determined that the City of Carrollton should amend the number of board members who may sit on the Main Street Program Board of Directors; and
WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton has found and determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the City to amend '35.187, Board of Directors, as set out below:
NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council, City of Carrollton, Commonwealth of Kentucky:
(1) That '35.187, Board of Directors, of the City of Carrollton Code of Ordinances pertaining to the Board of Directors of the Main Street Program should be amended as follows:
' 35.187 BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
(A) Structure. The business of the Carrollton Main Street Program shall include a Board constituted of **Nine** (Eleven) members appointed by the Mayor of the city, subject to the approval of the City Council. The term of office shall be four years, at which time the members shall be appointed or replaced, except that five of the board members who are initially appointed to the Board, shall have initial terms of two years, so that the terms of the Board members will be staggered. **Three** (Four) Board Members shall be citizens of the City of Carrollton who may or may not own, operate, or be employed by a business in Carrollton's Downtown Historic District. **Three** (Four) Board Members shall either own, operate, or be employed by a business in Carrollton's Downtown Historic District. The remaining three Board Members need only reside in Carroll County to be eligible to serve as Board Members. There shall be one Councilperson who shall be an ex officio member.
(B) Meeting. The Board shall conduct business monthly at the regular scheduled meeting time of 6:00 p.m. at City Hall on the fourth Thursday of each month. A quorum shall be determined anytime **Five** (Six) members of the Board of Directors are present. Meetings shall be conducted by the President of the Carrollton Main Street Program Board and shall follow Robert's Rules of Order. Vacancies in the Carrollton Main Street Program Board shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor of the city.
(C) Officers. The Board shall fill the following seven seats by election in January of each year. Each term shall be for one calendar year, at which time the officer shall be replaced or re-elected. One Board Members may hold more than one officer position.:
(1) President;
(2) Vice President;
(3) Secretary;
(4) Organization Chair;
(5) Design Chair;
(6) Promotions Chair;
(7) Economic Vitality Chair.
(2) That this Ordinance may be waived, altered, or suspended only by a change of ordinance.
(3) This ordinance shall become effective after two readings and the publication requirements have been met.
