ORDINANCE 2025-08

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 35.187 OF CHAPTER 35 OF THE CITY OF CARROLLTON CODE OF ORDINANCES WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton has found and determined that

the City of Carrollton should amend the number of board members who may sit on the Main Street Program Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Carrollton has found and determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the City to amend '35.187, Board of Directors, as set out below

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council, City of Carrollton, Commonwealth of Kentucky

That '35.187, Board of Directors, of the City of Carrollton Code of Ordinances pertaining to the Board of Directors of the Main Street Program should be amended as

35.187 BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

(A) Structure. The business of the Carrollton Main Street Program shall include a Board constituted of <u>Nine</u> [Eleven] members appointed by the Mayor of the city, subject to the approval of the City Council. The term of office shall be four years, at which time the members shall be appointed or replaced, except that five of the board members who are initially appointed to the Board, shall have initial terms of two years, so that the terms of the Board members will be staggered. <u>Three</u> [Four] Board Members shall be citizens of the City of Carrollton who may or may not own, operate, or be employed by a business in Carrollton's Downtown Historic District. <u>Three</u> [Four] Board Members shall either own, operate, or be employed by a business in Carrollton's Downtown Historic District.
