

Local runners compete in Madison 10K

Several local runners competed in the Madison Running Club's Firecracker 10K on Saturday, July 5, in Madison, Indiana.

Sue Webb, 40, of Milton, placed third overall among female runners and 27th overall both men and women for the top overall finish and fastest time among runners from Trimble and Carroll counties with a time of 42:32.

The next best finish among local runners was by Dustin Romans, 46, of Carrollton, who was second in the men's 45-49 division in 42:41, while Van Green, 37, of Milton, won the men's 35-39 division in 43:56 with Francisco Maldonado, 39, also of Milton, taking second in 44:02.

Rebecca Kainer, 18, who ran for Trimble County in high school but now lives in Dry Ridge, Kentucky, placed first in the girls 15-19 age division with a time of 45:35.

Other local women finishing in the top 15 included: Olivia Liter, 18, Milton, 7th in the girls 15-19 division in 1:01.10 and Mya Rowlett, 15, Milton, 10th in that division in 1:05.20; Savannah Mullikin, 33, Milton, 8th in the women's 30-34 division in 59:45; Megan Gilley, 37, of Bedford, 13th in the women's 35-39 division in 1:02.10; Maria Solis, 45, Milton, 12th in the

women's 45-49 division in 1:07.44; and Dawnice Moll, 56, Bedford, third in the women's 55-59 division in 1:05.18.

Among the men, Brian Smith, 31, Milton, ran fifth in the men's 30-34 division in 52:19 and Jaye Withrow, 32, Bedford, was 13th in that division in 1:02.40; and Shawn Finney, 36, Pendleton, was 12th in the men's 35-39 division in 1:27.44.

Madison Consolidated High School cross country coach Kristopher Sandlin, 33, of Madison, won the race in 32:09, finishing 15 seconds ahead of Conner Watson, 21, of Greenwood. It was Sandlin's

fourth straight win in the 10K and record ninth overall since his first win in 2013.

Cadence Traylor, a 2023 graduate of MCHS who has also ran for Indiana Wesleyan University, was the first female finisher with a time of 38:50.

**COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
TRIMBLE COUNTY FISCAL COURT
ORDINANCE NO. _____
AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO
STREET-LEGAL SPECIAL PURPOSE VEHICLES**

WHEREAS, 2025 Ky. Acts Ch. 89 (hereinafter "the Act") became law on March 26, 2025 and allows for the operation of street-legal special purposes on certain highways within the Commonwealth of Kentucky if permitted by Ordinance of the local government within those jurisdictional boundaries of Trimble County.

WHEREAS, SB 63 was signed into law and will be included within Ch. 89 to include a section of KRS Chapter 186 to allow street-legal special purposes on certain highways.

WHEREAS, Trimble County has the authority to permit the use of street-legal special purposes within its local government's jurisdictional boundaries, and it has authority to more stringent local ordinances governing street-legal special purpose vehicle safety equipment and operating than specified within the Act. adopt

WHEREAS, Trimble County wishes to allow such uses as provided in KRS Chapter 186.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF TRIMBLE, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY, THAT:

Definitions and rules

"Local government" means a city, county, charter county government, urban-county government, consolidated local government, or unified local government;

"Special purpose vehicle" means an all-terrain vehicle, utility terrain vehicle, minitruck, pneumatic-tired military vehicle, or full-size special purpose-built vehicle, including a vehicle that is self-constructed or built by the original equipment manufacturer and a vehicle that has been modified.

"Special purpose vehicle" does not include a low-speed vehicle as defined in KRS 186.010; and

"Street-legal special purpose vehicle" means a special purpose vehicle that meets requirements of this section and is equipped with all of the following:

a. One (1) or more headlamps;

b. One (1) or more tail lamps;

c. One (1) or more brake lamps;

d. A trail lamp or other lamp constructed and placed to illuminate the registration plate with a white light;

e. One (1) or more red reflectors on the rear of the vehicle;

f. An amber electric turn system, one (1) on each side of the front of the vehicle;

g. Amber or red electric turn signals on the rear of the vehicle;

h. A braking system, other than a parking brake;

i. A horn or other warning device;

j. A working muffler;

k. Rearview mirrors on the right and left side of the driver;

l. A windshield, unless the operator of the vehicle wears eye protection while operating the vehicle;

m. A speedometer, illuminated for nighttime operation;

n. A roll bar or roll cage;

o. For multi-passenger vehicles a seatbelt assembly that conforms to the federal motor vehicle safety standard provided in 49 C.F.R. sec. 571.209 for each designated seating position; and

p. Tires that have at least two thirty-seconds (2/32) of an inch or greater tire tread.

"Street-legal special purpose vehicle" does not include a low-speed vehicle as defined in KRS 186.010 or a vehicle primarily used for farm or agricultural activities.

Any later added or amended definitions as set out in the Act in the future by the Kentucky General Assembly are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference as if set forth fully herein.

A person shall not operate a street-legal special purpose vehicle on a highway if:

(a) The highway is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of a local government where the operation of special purpose vehicles has not been allowed by local ordinance; 2 ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

(b) The highway is a controlled-access system, including but not limited to interstate or parkway; or an

(c) The United States Department of Agriculture prohibits special purpose vehicles where the highway is located.

Nothing in this section authorizes the operation of a street-legal special purpose vehicle in an area that is not open to motor vehicle use.

Street-legal special purpose vehicles are prohibited from traveling a distance greater than twenty (20) miles on a highway displaying centerline pavement markings.

Minitrucks shall not be operated as street-legal special purpose vehicles on a highway that has been constructed pursuant to a federal highway program.

Except as otherwise provided in this section, a street-legal special purpose vehicle shall:

(a) Be registered in accordance with Section 3 of this Act as stated herein;

(b) Be insured by the owner or operator for the payment of tort liabilities in the same form and amounts as set forth in KRS 304.39-110 for motorcycles; and

(c) Comply with all other requirements in the Act.

Upon registration of any street-legal special purpose vehicle under Section 3 of the Act, as stated herein, the county clerk shall issue the owner a motorcycle registration plate for the vehicle.

Street-legal special purpose vehicles shall have an inspection completed by a certified inspector as required by Section 5 of this Act.

An applicant renewing his or her registration for a street-legal special purpose vehicle pursuant to Section 3 of this Act shall certify that the street-legal special purpose vehicle still meets all of the equipment requirements as stated above. The Transportation Cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to implement this section.

Before the owner street-legal special purpose vehicle, may operate it or permit its operation upon a highway, the owner shall apply for registration in accordance with administrative regulations promulgated by the cabinet, which also includes obtaining proof of insurance in compliance with the Act. The annual registration fee for a street-legal special purpose vehicle shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

An owner of a street-legal special purpose vehicle, as defined in Section 1 of the Act, seeking to register under Section 3 of the Act shall, before submitting his or her application for title to the county clerk, have the special purpose vehicle inspected by a certified inspector. There shall be a twenty-five dollar (\$25) fee for the certification of a special purpose vehicle, payable to the sheriff's office.

Street-Legal special purpose vehicles shall be allowed to the extent permitted by the Act on all highways that are located within the jurisdictional limits of Trimble County.

THIS ORDINANCE shall become effective on June 27, 2025, upon its passage advertisement according to law. and The first reading of this Ordinance was made and approved by a majority vote at a meeting of the Trimble County Fiscal Court on June 16th, 2025.

The second reading of this Ordinance was made at a meeting of the Trimble County Fiscal Court on July 7, 2025 and upon motion by Magistrate D Jones and second by Magistrate Crystal Whitice the same was called for a vote and approved by a majority vote of the Trimble County Fiscal Court.
