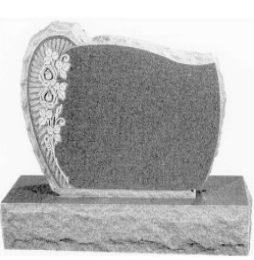
Aside from his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother, Kenneth McKinney, and one sister, Diane McKinney.

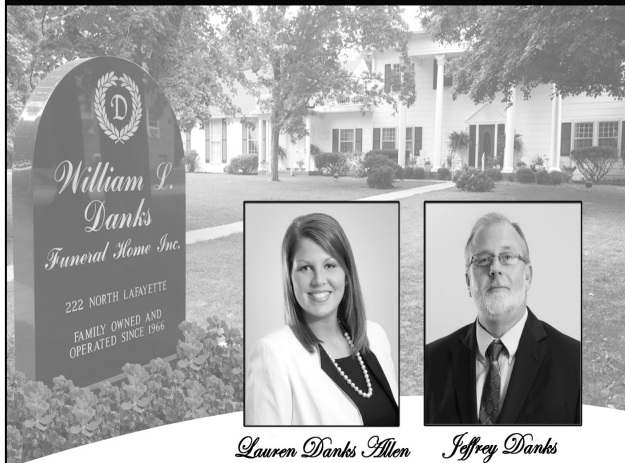
