We can ponder how Sovereignty might have fared in the Preakness, but I think there’s enough evidence to suggest that we could be and should be celebrating the sports 14th Triple Crown champion.

Journalism will head back home to California for a well-deserved freshening. Hats off to trainer Mike McCarthy and the connections for competing in all three legs, something they had prepped Journalism expertly for. Baeza will be on that plane back to Santa Anita as well. He’s not quite at the level of the Derby and Preakness winners. Sovereignty will probably stay put in the friendly confines of Saratoga and prep for the Midsummer Derby, more commonly called the Travers Stakes, which will be run on August 23rd for the 156th time at the Derby distance of a mile and a quarter.

The other major prep is the Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park in New Jersey on July 19th. I doubt that anyone will be standing in line to face Sovereignty any time soon. We’ll see where Journalism surfaces, probably in the

Haskell. He could opt for the Pacific Classic at Del Mar on August 30th against older horses. It’s also a “Win and You’re In” qualifier for the Breeders Cup Classic, which will also be held at Del Mar for the 4th time.

It was a satisfying Triple Crown run void of any crazy outcomes, which Saratoga is renowned for. The best horses ran their best, and that’s what we want to see as racing fans. Sovereignty clearly separated himself and is in a tier above this generation. He’s a special horse handled by very smart and savvy connections and has the perfect pilot. He’ll be a formidable foe for any horse of any age that may want to challenge him. It’s too bad that we weren’t treated to a Triple Crown accomplishment, one that was well within Sovereignty’s scope. Derby replays are great, but there’s a reason they call it the Triple Crown. Bill Mott will invite anyone to come try on his Double Crown winner and warn them that they better bring their A game, something Sovereignty does every time he steps on a race-track. We’ll never know what might have been, but what we do know is good enough, for now.

ORDINANCE NO. 10, SERIES 2025

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A 150 DAY MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE, PROCESSING, AND APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OR EXPANSION OF DATA CENTERS OF ANY SIZE, ALL PRIVATE UTILITIES, ALL PRIVATE UTILITY BUILDINGS AND ALL DATA STORAGE FACILITIES WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF LA GRANGE, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, Oldham County has experienced increased interest in the development of data centers within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, data centers, while contributing to economic development, also have significant impacts on infrastructure, energy consumption, land use, and environmental sustainability; and

WHEREAS, the current zoning and development regulations may not adequately address the unique characteristics, demands, and potential cumulative effects of data centers; and

WHEREAS, the La Grange City Council finds it necessary to evaluate existing policies, infrastructure capacity, and long-term planning objectives regarding data centers; and

WHEREAS, the La Grange City Council has the power to impose temporary moratoria to protect public health, safety, and welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LA GRANGE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Moratorium Imposed

A moratorium is hereby imposed on the acceptance, processing, and approval of all new applications related to the establishment, development, or expansion of data centers of any size, all private utilities, all private utility buildings and all data storage facilities within the jurisdiction of the City of La Grange for a period of 150 days from the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Purpose

The purpose of this moratorium is to allow time for the mayor, council, staff, consultants, and relevant stakeholders to consider infrastructure and utility capacity, environmental and land use impacts, economic benefits for the community, and best practices and regulatory frameworks from comparable jurisdictions and subsequently review and update applicable policies, zoning regulations and standards related to data center development.

SECTION 3. Exemptions


This moratorium shall not apply to:


- Applications that have been filed prior to the effective date of the adoption of this ordinance
- Jurisdictions outside the City of La Grange


SECTION 4. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and be enforceable following publication as required by KRS 424.

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A 150 DAY MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE, PROCESSING, AND APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OR EXPANSION OF DATA CENTERS OF ANY SIZE, ALL PRIVATE UTILITIES, ALL PRIVATE UTILITY BUILDINGS AND ALL DATA STORAGE FACILITIES WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF OLDHAM COUNTY FISCAL COURT

WHEREAS, OLDHAM COUNTY has experienced increased interest in the development of data centers within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, data centers, while contributing to economic development, also have significant impacts on infrastructure, energy consumption, land use, and environmental sustainability; and

WHEREAS, the current zoning and development regulations may not adequately address the unique characteristics, demands, and potential cumulative effects of data centers; and

WHEREAS, OLDHAM COUNTY FISCAL COURT finds it necessary to evaluate existing policies, infrastructure capacity, and long-term planning objectives regarding data centers; and

WHEREAS, OLDHAM COUNTY FISCAL COURT Has the power to impose temporary moratoria to protect the public health, safety, and welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Moratorium Imposed

A moratorium is hereby imposed on the acceptance, processing, and approval of all new applications related to the establishment, development, or expansion of data centers of any size, all private utilities, all private utility buildings and all data storage facilities within the jurisdiction of OLDHAM COUNTY FISCAL COURT for a period of 150 days from the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. Purpose

The purpose of this moratorium is to allow time for the judge-executive, magistrates, staff, consultants, and relevant stakeholders to consider infrastructure and utility capacity, environmental and land use impacts, economic benefits for the community, and best practices and regulatory frameworks from comparable jurisdictions and subsequently review and update applicable policies, zoning regulations, and standards related to data center development.

SECTION 3. Exemptions

This moratorium shall not apply to:

- Applications that have been filed prior to the effective date of the adoption of an ordinance
- Incorporated areas within Oldham County
- The installation, construction, expansion and maintenance of broadband and telecommunications provider networks already serving Oldham County residents and businesses, under agreements with Oldham County Fiscal Court and/or with Kentucky state government. Furthermore, it shall not apply to buildings, huts, terminals, pedestals or other structures used by broadband and telecommunications providers in the course of serving their Oldham County customers.

SECTION 4. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
