Mrs. Claudie Thomas was in Covington to see her daughter and family over the weekend.

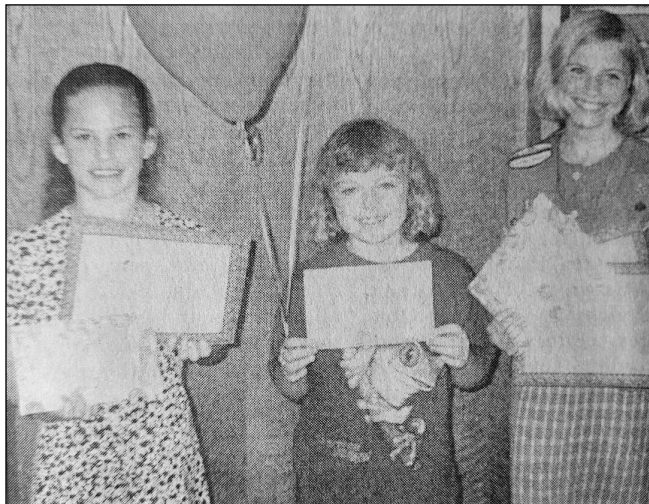
